DOCKS & RENTALS

Dock Renewal and Boatyard Renewal — You will receive your dock lease and/or Eastport Boatyard storage lease and invoice this month. Each year, you need to sign and return the leases with your boat and/or trailer information *including a copy of the current boat registration and the declaration page of your boat insurance*. Our current BLYC insurance carrier requires this to be on file in our office.

Thank you for being compliant with this requirement. If your lease agreement is not included with your invoice, please contact me at docksandrentals@buckeyelakeyc.com.

Please note that construction on the front basin is on schedule and that we expect all boats can return to Watkins Island this spring. The amenities on the island will include water and electricity for all boat docks. Our dock rental fees for 2024 are as follows:

Eastport Docks	\$1,200	Area 8 Docks	\$1,300
Watkins Island East	\$2,100	Watkins Island Front Basin	\$2,100
Watkins Island West Basin	\$2,100	Watkins Island Back Basin	\$ 620
Eastport Storage (Nov 1- Oct 31) \$ 450			

The dock application is available on the website under Docks and Rentals. We also have storage areas available in the Eastport Boatyard.

Eastport Boatyard Cleanup has begun! We are starting with cleaning up the fence rows. We have vegetation from both sides of the fence imposing on our fence. We are also working to remove the boats that are abandoned. Hopefully most of these poor boats will be removed by boating season.

MEMBERSHIP

With Winterfest behind us, we can now start looking forward to spring and the upcoming boating season! It should be a great one with the new front basin!

As mentioned before, membership is at capacity with a waitlist for new members. If you sponsor a prospective member, they will be added to the waitlist once I receive their online application and two sponsor letters. Remember, only the actual member and not the first mate can sponsor a new applicant. Also, the only applicants not subjected to the waitlist would be a member's adult child who is under age 40.

Effective December 1st, 2023 securing a spot on the waitlist also requires a refundable \$500 deposit, which will be applied to the initiation dues once the prospective member comes off of the waitlist. Also, if a prospective member's circumstances change (e.g. move...) the \$500 will be refunded to them.

We should know what member attrition looks like soon and get membership opened up once again. It is important for prospective members to get on the waitlist now so they can be considered once membership reopens.

If you haven't set up your member portal, please get that done. So far, well over half of the members have signed up. Let's get to 100%! You can go to the club website www.buckeyelakeyc.com and click on the "Member Portal" box on the home page. There is also a link right there for a brief tutorial on using the portal. The main functionality currently is that you can view all of your club charges (including all the chit details) in real time and pay your monthly bill online. More functionality will be added in the future as this will be the hub for everything! Also, you now have the ability to receive your monthly statements, monthly *Log* and weekly news update electronically. Please reach out to the office to take advantage of this because it saves the club a lot of money by being paperless.

If there is anyone you know, like and care about that you think would be a good member for the club, have them submit an online membership application and get on the waitlist.

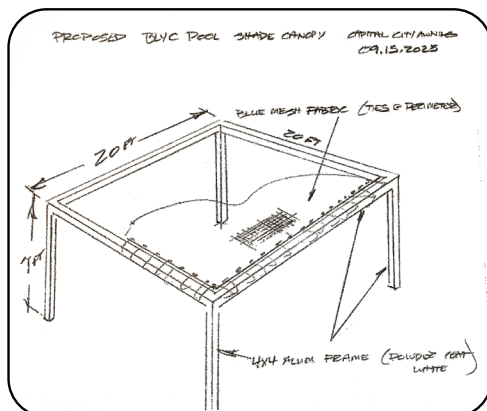
Welcome to winter and hopefully everyone has survived this year's Winterfest activities. Work on the front basin continues and the weather continues to cooperate allowing us to make progress.

The photos on the right illustrate the placement of the steel I-beams which will make up the outer wall on the west side of the basin.

The third photo shows the steel I-beams on the east side of the basin with both the outer and inner I-beams in place. These I-beams will be tied together with a cross support and then tied together at the top with more steel. By the time you read this article, the removal of the old steel bulkhead should be in progress. We continue to have construction meetings on the first Wednesday of every month to ensure the work progresses in a timely manner.

I have exciting news for those members who make use of the pool in the summertime. You may recall, we have been using four poles and a sun sail to provide shade for the swimmers on the north side of the pool. As you may be aware, with the high winds we experienced last summer we had difficulty keeping the shade sail intact and even had to re-cement one of the four standing poles. The board has approved the acquisition of a shade canopy structure. This structure will be 20 by 20 feet square and mimic the structure we currently use on the band deck. The difference is the shade structure will have a flat fabric roof that will block the sun but allow rain to pass through to keep the lawn watered. This roof is secured to the frame the same way the current roof is attached to the band tent. The picture below provides a good illustration of what it will look like. This structure would also allow the side curtains to be attached to block the sun as it lowers in the western sky. We are anticipating to have this structure in place before the summer season.

I will continue to keep you all apprised of progress on the basin. In the mean time let's all hope for a short winter and the start of the spring and summer seasons.

PROPOSED BY-LAWS CHANGE

The Board of Governors is currently considering changes to Article XI. Rule 24 of the By-Laws regarding DOCK BOXES.

As required by Article X of the BLYC Constitution, the changes are being published in the January issue of the Log. The Board of Governors would appreciate all feedback and suggestions from the membership.

CURRENT BY-LAWS

ARTICLE XI. RULES GOVERNING CONDUCT ON PREMISES AND USE OF FACILITIES.

RULE 24 - DOCK & STORAGE RULES

- 7b. All gear incidental to storage must be removed immediately after launching or be disposed of.
- 7c. Boats must be launched by June 1st or demurrage of 2 ½ cents lineal foot/day will be charged.

PROPOSED BY-LAWS CHANGE

ARTICLE XI. RULES GOVERNING CONDUCT ON PREMISES AND USE OF FACILITIES.

RULE 24 - DOCK & STORAGE RULES

ADD THE FOLLOWING...

- 7d. No items or dock boxes are permitted on any pier, dock, or walkway in any of the docking areas.

REASONS FOR REQUESTED CHANGE

The new piers and walkways are only 5 feet in width. Adding a Dock Box and/or leaving items on the walkway would create a trip hazard.

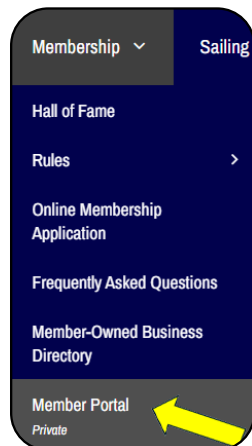

FINANCE COMMITTEE

By now you should have received your January statements which include the standard annual charges for 2024. ***As mentioned in the December Log, the net change from 2023 to 2024 reflects an increase of \$200, not including dock rentals.***

This increase was primarily driven by casualty insurance, utilities (electric), software security/systems, anticipated equipment repair/replacement and increased labor costs over the last two years. We also needed to pass on the bank 3% credit card fee for members that choose to pay their dues/dock fees with a credit card versus the club absorbing the cost (~\$20k/year). Note that we continue to accept checks/EFT as payment without incurring the 3% fee if you choose.

The annual capital improvement cost of \$325 remained the same from 2023 and will be used for general facility capital improvements in 2024 including the replacement of the rear staircase which is a safety concern.

The bill also includes the second of three annual installments of the special assessment for replacing the seawall and front basin expansion & improvements. The full \$500 was billed up front this year instead of over 10 months as we did in 2023. We apologize for any confusion this may have caused, understanding that it may appear as though the total increased versus spreading the amount over 10 months as we did in 2023. We decided to bill the full amount to make the process more straightforward/less confusing, and with the understanding that in 2023 there were a significant number of members who preferred to pay the total amount one time versus monthly. You can arrange with the office to pay the \$500 over 10 months with no interest charge if you prefer.

Finally, dock rental increased on the island to the new amount to equal what the east side island dock renters have paid since the docks were rebuilt a few years ago. It provided them with wider/longer steel framed slips, space for lifts, electric, water access, improved walkways, island security and easy island access. The prior years were purposefully held down due to the disrepair, slip size, no electric or water and walkway accessibility. The Eastport and Area 800 dock rental fees were increased also. The dock rental fee will be billed in February with the expectation that members will return the requested boat insurance documentation and rental agreement with their payment.

The Birth of Watkins Island

In the Club's early years, members didn't have the opportunity to enjoy the Club as much in the wintertime as we do today. The first Clubhouse was much smaller, situated over the water on the east end of the island, and transportation to and from the lake was far more difficult than it is today. But, BLYC members have never shied away from an opportunity for a good party! In those early years, members would gather for a "Tar Social" each winter at various banquet halls in Newark and Columbus.

The Fourth Tar Social — February 18, 1909 — was billed as a "Big Improvement Jubilee." The Club had its home on "Sunken Island" which had recently been raised with dredge material and the original clubhouse and docks had been built. But, there was more more to do — not only to make BLYC a "real club" but also to help make Buckeye Lake a "real lake."

The event was held at the United Commerical Travelers building near Goodale Park in Columbus (current location of the Pizzuti building — a satellite of the Columbus Museum of Art) and the evening began as scheduled with the Club's eastern contingent from Newark along with five large delegations from other Inter-Lake clubs arriving by train. The hall was decorated in nautical fare — walls & ceilings draped in burgees of I-LYA and other member clubs intermingled with ship's wheels, ropes, sailcloth, and other gear. A company of "sailors" in jackets and flared trousers stood at the ready to serve the meal. "Clang, Clang" rang the bell from Commodore Lynch's station and some 250 freshwater sailors enjoyed the meal...

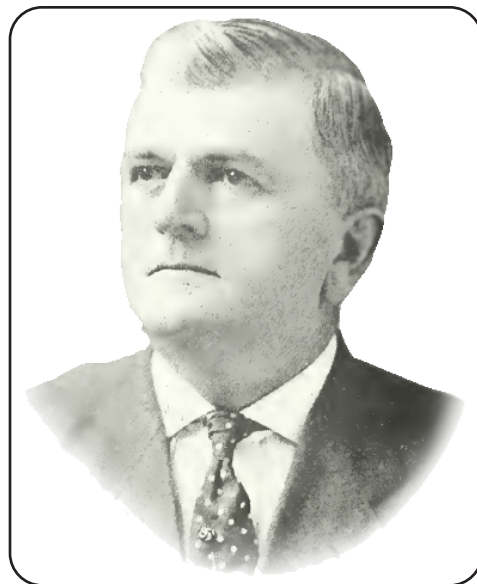

Clearly the meal had a "flavor" of both Buckeye Lake and Lake Erie influences. Following dinner the "Gasoline Lubricators" were served in small "tanks" labeled "Gasoline — A Substitute for Beer for the Newark Trade." I'm sure there had to be a good story behind that.

Speeches by Commodore Lynch and others followed dinner. The keynote address was delivered by George Watkins, President of the State Board of Public Works, who spoke of improvements at Buckeye Lake — both those that had been completed and those contemplated for the future. He reported that boat registrations at the lake the previous season had brought in \$6,000 which was to be used for maintenance and improvements at Buckeye Lake. His remarks were received with "almost irrepressible applause" and at its conclusion a "spontaneous, resounding, unanimous vote" was taken to rename BLYC's once watery home "Watkins Island" in honor of Mr. Watkins and all he had done to spearhead improvements at the lake.

A few weeks later, on April 8, 1909, the Directors of the Buckeye Lake Building Company, who held the lease

on the island and owned the clubhouse, reaffirmed the vote of the membership and officially re-christened "Sunken Island" as "Watkins Island." A resolution was drafted and sent to the State Board of Public Works notifying them of the change, acknowledging the contributions of Mr. Watkins, and detailing the efforts and accomplishments of the Club in improvements at the lake in encouragement of further efforts by the Board to do the same.

This month, on Sunday, February 18th, Watkins Island will "officially" be 115 years old. Now, if we can just find the recipe for "Gasoline Lubricators," we could properly celebrate this historic occasion!

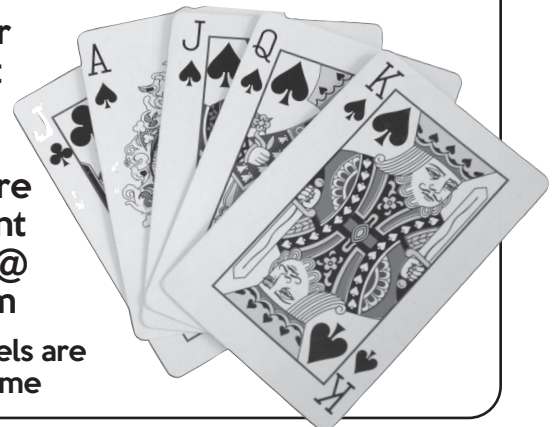


