# HOUSE & GROUNDS - Vice Commodore Bill Collinson

As I write this article, the trees on my property are budding out, the weather is getting warmer, and people have started to work on their boats in preparation for another season.

Improvements are also happening at the Club. As you are aware, we have had security cameras installed in the club, on the island, and in the parking lot. I have heard some comments, hopefully in jest, that the Club is spying on the members. This could not be further from the truth. These security cameras are in place to provide protection for the club and its members. While the cameras run 24/7, the images produced are not accessed unless damage has occurred on the club premises, and we need to identify the cause and the perpetrators. Further you should know that only club management has access to review the images produced by the cameras.

At long last, I have been informed by Acme Elevator that our new elevator for the front porch has been delivered. In recent communications with Mark Brown of Acme Elevator, it is his intent to have the elevator installed sometime during the week of March 18. I have submitted the plans for the pool shade canopy to the permitting office of Licking County and am expecting the permit to be in hand shortly. The project will also see us removing the stumps that currently exist in the grassy area north of the pool and will also include bringing in fill to level the grassy area with the existing concrete apron and provide better drainage for the area. Once done, the new surface will have sod put in place to make sure that the area is ready for use at the beginning of the pool season.

To improve the maintenance of the docks at Area 8 and Eastport, we have constructed a portable power washing cart that will allow us to power wash both structures at a reasonable interval which will improve the cleanliness of the docks. In addition, if you have been down at East Port, you will have noticed the replacement of numerous dock boards in preparation for the upcoming boating season.

Construction on the front basin continues. The new seawall to the south and west of the island is in place and by the time you read this, the collars that will provide the support for the decking will be in place. The removal of the old seawall has started and should be completed soon. I would like to remind you all that all the finger docks in both the east and west basin have been constructed and are ready for installation. The concrete work to finish the front patio will begin in early April. Once the framing for the docks is in place, our electricians will be wiring the outlets as well as the lights for the new structure.

The construction committee for the rear staircase has now met on two occasions. We now have architectural drawings of the new staircase, and while it is constructed using galvanized steel, we will be incorporating panels to soften and improve the curbside appeal of the staircase. I will have more information on the project as time goes by. It is currently our intent to have this project completed in the fall.

We are currently looking for a full-time grounds keeper. If you know of anyone that might be interested in the position, please let the office know.

*Dock Assignments:* All dock assignments on Watkins Island, Area 8, and Eastport are posted and dated on the membership board in the bar area and will be updated as changes occur.

Our members have done an amazing job of returning

their signed dock lease agreements and Eastport storage yard agreements! If your declaration page to your boat Insurance is not renewed until late spring, please send a copy to docksandrentals@buckeyelakeyc.com when you receive it. BLYC is required by our liability insurance carrier to have it on file.

*Docks Available!* You spend your summer at the Club, why not enjoy the convenience of docking your boat here? We have Eastport docks available. Parking for Eastport docks is in the Eastport boatyard. It is easy and convenient!

*Dock Waiting List:* As the new docks on Watkins Island are completed, you may ask yourselves what you need to do to have a dock on the Island. BLYC has a dock waiting list for all docking areas. Go to our website and complete the dock application with your preferred dock area (Eastport, Area 8, Watkins Island (east, front basin, west basin)). Consideration for a dock is outlined in the BLYC Constitution and By-Laws and are followed for dock assignments when docks become available. When we receive your application, you will be added to the wait list posted on the membership board in the bar.

*Eastport Boatyard:* When your boat goes in the water this spring, what will you do with your boat trailer? The lease agreement for boat and trailer storage is for the entire year. Put your boat in the water and leave your trailer in BLYC's secured storage area!

Cleanup of the boatyard fence row will begin in April when we have warmer weather conditions. We are looking for volunteers to help clear the weeds and vines. It is good exercise and a great opportunity to get to know your fellow Club members. It is community service since this will make BLYC Eastport boatyard more attractive to the Buckeye Lake community.



# LOOKING AFT - P/C Steve Harris, BLYC Historian April, 1906...

# "YACHTSMEN MEET AND FORM A CLUB"

That was the headline in the *The* Ohio State Journal the morning of Wednesday, April 25, 1906. The evening before, approximately 40 men from Columbus and Newark met at Leachman's Chop House in Columbus to discuss the prospects of forming a yacht club in the Columbus area. Presentations were made by officers of the Maumee River Yacht Club and of I-LYA. By the end of the evening, 15 men had elected to join the start-up effort, Lawrence Sackett of Columbus was elected as the first Commodore, and committees were established to draft a constitution & by-laws and to select a name and emblems for the new club. But where would they sail? The only logical choice was the old "Licking Summit Reservoir" of the defunct Ohio Erie Canal. (Hoover, Alum Creek, and other reservoirs around Columbus wouldn't be built until decades later). They set a second meeting date of May 6 on Orchard Island in the reservoir, about 30 miles east of town.

While an admirable venture, the news was not necessarily well received neither in the local communities around the lake who enjoyed their secluded and peaceful fishing paradise away from the influence of the city, nor in the greater yachting community. Two days later, the Toledo Press came out with its story about the upstart club, recognizing the longstanding rivalry between Toledo and Columbus in everything ... except yachting. Seeing the potential for further competition between the cities, the story concluded, "To show Columbus sailors their hearts are in the right place, members of TYC will arrange to ship reservoirs of water to the capitol during the late summer months that the croquet ground of the



Columbus club be flooded to a depth sufficient"... for its... "yachtsmen to continue their sports." Obviously, the opinion of sailing on the old Licking Reservoir held by these "big water" sailors from Lake Erie was not nearly as optimistic as those of the founding members of the Club.

In the eleven days intervening, the officers, directors, and committees were very busy, not only preparing for their particular assignments, but also with the goal of attracting additional members. The press was very cooperative and published several stories about the upcoming meeting on Orchard Island. The day of the event, the Journal published a photo of the Commodore's sloop, Buckeye. But, although designated as a public park "to be known as Buckeye Lake" by the Ohio Legislature years earlier, and also likely out of habit, the press still frequently referred to the lake as "Licking Reservoir."

By meeting day, May 6, membership had grown to nearly 40. Aboard members' boats, 60 members and prospects traveled by boat from the Park to Charles Miller's home on Orchard Island. The meeting was convened and the name "Buckeye Lake Yacht Club" was adopted, along with the Constitution, flags, emblems, and fees. Dues were set at \$4.00 per year with an initiation fee of \$2.00 for those joining after July 1, 1906. Regattas were planned for Memorial Day, Independence Day, and Labor Day of the 1906 season with the first Annual Meeting to be held, and new officers to be elected, in September.

The press again enthusiastically touted the efforts of the new Club. This brought new, favorable attention to the lake and an increase in tourism and visitors. This, in turn, stimulated business around the lake and, together, the lake and the Club developed rapidly. Following this first official meeting of the Club, the press seldom, if ever again, referred to the lake as "Licking Reservoir"... *Buckeye Lake had been born!*

# CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

### **Tame Your Rudder**

The Bible makes numerous references to ships and sailing, but only twice does it mention the part of a ship critical to guiding its direction, the rudder. When the Apostle Paul was involved in a shipwreck off the coast of the island of Malta, at the height of the storm that threatened the lives of all on board, they decided to run ashore on the beach by casting off the anchors, loosening the ropes that tied off the rudder, and hoisting the foresail (see Acts 27:13-44). Basically, the crew put the boat at the mercy of the wind.

The other mention of a rudder was made by Jesus' halfbrother James. In his stormy epistle, James cautions his readers to watch what comes out of their mouths. He says "A small rudder makes a huge ship turn wherever the pilot chooses to go, even though the winds are strong. In the same way, the tongue is a small thing that makes grand speeches. But a tiny spark can set a great forest on fire." (James 3:4-5, NLT)

James goes on to explain that our tongues can be "untamable." If a person can control his/her tongue, s/he is, most likely, self-controlled in every other area of life.

The rudder of a boat controls the boat's heading. Likewise, our words determine the direction of our lives. How many people have shipwrecked relationships, opportunities, and reputations because of careless lies, hateful accusations, or prideful boastings? On the other hand, as Solomon reminds us in Proverbs "Everyone enjoys a fitting reply; it is wonderful to say the right thing at the right time!" (Proverbs 15:23, NLT)

Decide, today, to think twice before loosening the ropes that tie off the rudder of your tongue. May our words be fitting, spoken at appropriate times, thereby taking us to beautiful destinations.
