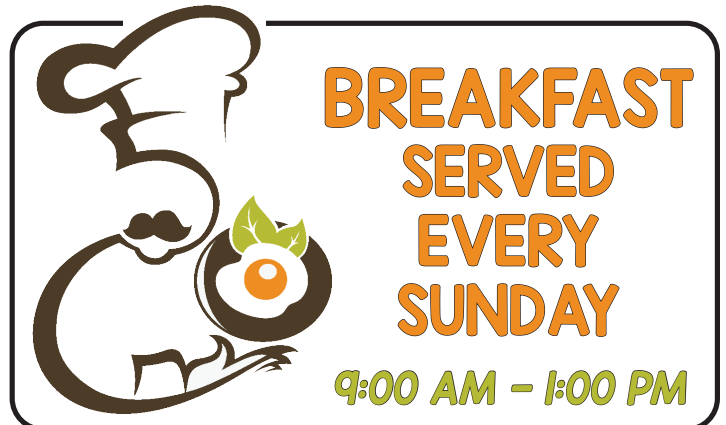
The elevator has been installed and is operational.

Welcome Back to Watkins Island Docking!

Thank you, Club Members, especially those of you who dock on Watkins Island for being patient this past year.

Thank you to all past Commodores, Governors, and Trustees for ensuring the safety of our beloved island for generations to come and enhancing our patio and docks for all of us to enjoy!

One of the great traditions of the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club is coming to the island by boat for swimming and dining! We are back! There will be 10 docks with bumpers and cleats along the outside wall of the front basin and the west basin. There are also 5 docks inside the front basin and several docks inside the west basin. The front basin and west basin docks are marked BLYC on signs. Since there is a commercial bar and grill next to Watkins Island, we chose to mark them BLYC instead of transient to not let anyone who is not a member think it is okay to park here and go next door. Empty docks only means that someone is enjoying a boat ride on Buckeye Lake! Please respect their space.

In Area 8 we have placed PRIVATE signs on the end of each dock to dissuade nonmembers from parking in your dock. The only BLYC transient docking in Area 8 is at the end of the pier where we can handle 2 boats.

All Eastport transient docks are marked with BLYC signs. There are also two transient docks at the end of each pier. There are no transient docks on Racers Row.

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Hope As an Anchor for the Soul

A dozen years ago, I spent almost two weeks with my son, Jeff, on his sailboat as we traveled down the Intracoastal Waterway. At that time, I was a novice to the nautical world, so I learned a lot about boating and sailing on this trip. Even though the purpose of boating is to travel distances over the water, a critical aspect of many trips aboard a vessel is the science of anchoring. I knew very little about anchors except that they were heavy, and I discovered weight was only part of the formula. The shape of the anchor, the length and composition of the rode, the conditions of the bottom, and the flow of the water are several critical factors in determining which type of anchor to use.

Obviously, the purpose of anchors is to keep the boat from moving when the skipper does not want it to move. But the deeper purpose is peace of mind. When Jeff and I were faced with a decision whether to anchor in a protected cove as Hurricane Sandy's tropical winds approached, or to seek harbor at a marina, we chose the marina because we were not sure we had adequate anchor gear to weather the storm. Staying at a marina was certainly more expensive, but it provided much more serenity. We also ate much better at the marina than we would have otherwise, but that's another story.

The Bible says that hope is like an anchor: "Therefore, we who have fled to him (God) for refuge can have great confidence as we hold to the hope that lies before us. This hope is a strong and trustworthy anchor for our souls" (*Hebrews 6: 18b-19a, NLT*). Because God has promised ultimate good to those who trust in Him, and because it is impossible for God to lie, this gives us the assurance and security we will be recipients of His blessings both now and in eternity. Like an anchor, this hope can hold us firm amid the storms that swirl around us each day.

LOOKING AFT

Just this past week, to celebrate the completion of the new seawall & docks and the expansion of the front patio, we held a ceremony to rededicate Watkins Island. Last month, I wrote about George Watkins, his career, and why our predecessors chose to name our island for him. This month, I share an excerpt from our Centennial history book, An Illustrated History of the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club by Dr. Tony Lisska, which tells about not only the works Watkins spearheaded to improve the lake, but also the efforts to transform "Sunken Island" into a real island — the first seawall and island expansion project, 116 years ago.

George Watkins and the Rendering of a Reservoir into a Lake

The most important "honorary member" appointment was George H. Watkins, the president of Ohio's State Board of Public Works. Watkins, whose name now identifies the home island of the BLYC, knew how to go about making the former reservoir into a lake. Furthermore, his state agency had authority to undertake and complete this goal. As Armstrong noted fifty years ago, this "array of notable members presented an impressive front in BLYC's campaign for improvement of its waters." Hence began the efforts to render "a stumpy reservoir into a real lake."

Before Watkins could begin the conversion of a stumpy backwater swamp into a sustainable lake, the 1908 season began and witnessed the vigor of the Club's third annual Memorial and Independence Day regattas. In July, several officers and members represented the Club at the I-LYA regatta at Put-In-Bay. Before the season ended, a new porch across the front of the clubhouse provided shelter for the Club's growing porch fleet.

Following the summer season, Watkins got down to serious business with the restoration project on the Licking Summit Reservoir. On Labor Day 1908,

visitors to the Lake saw its waters rapidly withdrawing from its shores, and there was no regatta to witness. Visible sail-craft lay naked and dry atop often-sodden Sunken Island, which was standing high out of a sea of mud, gravel, stumps and waterlogged tree trunks. The Sages of Millersport were most indignant that their canal was becoming only a groove of slime. At the rate the water was falling, the lake soon would be mere puddles surrounded by ooze. Fish would be left stranded and most certainly dying. What a calamity was befalling their fishing preserve! Yachtsmen, on the other hand, were showing signs of enthusiasm and happiness. With waste-weir and lock sluices wide open, the lake was being drained as quickly and thoroughly as possible to put it in dry-dock for caulking and removal of its under-water impediments. Indeed, the old reservoir was about to become a bona-fide lake. The conversion of Licking Reservoir into Buckeye Lake, under the personal direction and supervision of George Watkins, finally was under way.

During autumn of 1908, state workers tore out the decrepit, old wooden waste-weir and replaced it with one of concrete. They put lock walls, gates and sluices into water-holding and serviceable condition. They rebuilt, strengthened and repaired considerable portions of the north embankment, relaying much of its inner lining of stonework in cement mortar. During the winter months, when the lake's "puddles" were frozen over, the state proceeded with removal of the normally inundated forests of stumps and tree trunks; these trunks were cut down as low as possible. Although several thaws prevented continuous full-scale activity, many of these hazards to navigation were eliminated throughout greater portions of the lake's major basins lying westward from Middle Passage. When time came to close

sluices for impounding late winter and spring runoff for the following season's boating, further repair and restoration work was abandoned until the following winter.

While the state workers were engaged in restoration projects, the Yacht Club itself made its first major improvements on and around Sunken Island.

Armstrong wrote:

The efforts to impress members with the necessity of their participation in "digging carnivals" came to naught. Introduced to picks and shovels, they looked upon the inanimate objects as venomous serpents.

With little enthusiasm for such pick and shovel work, the improvement program was placed in the hands of contractors from Columbus. The island was enlarged and most of it raised to the level of the boathouse floor. To accomplish this, concrete seawalls first were constructed around the island's shores. Then the enclosed space was filled with materials excavated to deepen the water under boat stalls, to open and add depth to the channel between island and main shore, and to increase depth elsewhere beside and beyond these walls. The island's new surface was seeded early in the following spring. Buckeye Lake Building Company met the costs and charged these against its account with the Club, which soon covered it by purchase of additional shares of the company's stock. The walls built in 1908 followed generally the lines of those now surrounding Watkins Island.

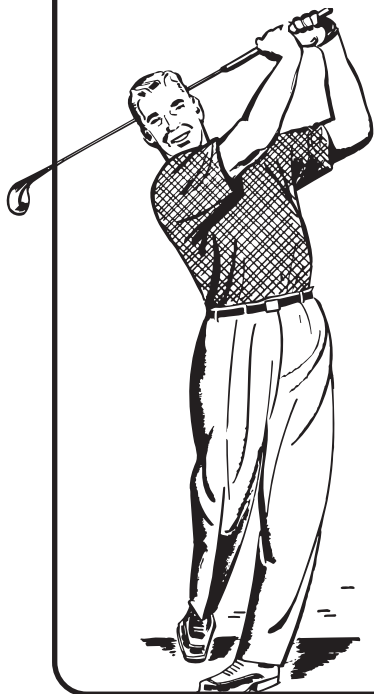



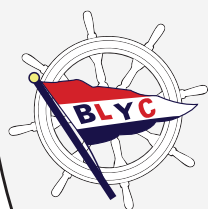
