HOUSE & GROUNDS

With the Fourth of July in our rearview mirror, the club is well into its summer season.

You may recall, we had to close the club from Tuesday, July 9 until 4:00 pm on Friday, July 12. I want to take this opportunity to explain to you what transpired during that time. As you know, our club facilities are located on an island. As such, it is necessary for us to have a sewer pump station on the island. This pump station moves the waste water from the island to the existing sewer line on the mainland. In that pump station we have two pumps, — a main pump as well as a backup. There are float switches that activate the pumps when the level reaches a certain height in the tank. These pumps push the sewage through a manifold into a 2-inch line that takes it over to the mainland sewer system. It was this manifold that failed causing the pump station not to operate.

The company we have been using diagnosed the problem as being defective pumps. However, due to their delay in obtaining these pumps and their failure to communicate with us as to what was happening, a fellow club member Mark DelMatto of FEECORP, offered his services to the club. Mark's team came out promptly, identified the problem as a clogged manifold, and resolved the matter in a timely fashion.

While the current repair is working, we will be having Mark's team return to properly rebuild the manifold and reinstall the backup pump. This process will require one day to complete. We will aim to do the work on either a Monday or Tuesday to prevent any disruption to the operation of the club.

Based on their lack of service, I have terminated any service agreements with the previous company and going forward we will be using FEECORP for all of our pump station needs. Again, I want to thank Mark DelMatto and his company for stepping forward and assisting the club in its time of need.

We have also developed some issues with our filter system that operates the large pool. We have purchased a new filter system which should be installed by the time you are reading this article. This installation will require the pool being shut down for one day. As I indicated in my previous article, the baby pool, due to a collapsed pipe, has been shut down for the season. The board will determine what should be done with the pool during one of our fall meetings. Once a decision has been made, I will inform members in the Log.

Our club is a wonderful old building, emphasis on old, and does require a lot of care and maintenance. House and Grounds will continue in its efforts to identify maintenance concerns and rectify them as quickly and economically possible.

Wishing you all a wonderful summer and hope to see you at the club.

DOCKS & RENTALS

It is great to see our members coming to the Club by boat! On fun days the front basin is usually full of our members' boats, using our transient docks marked by the green BLYC signs!

Transient Docking Regulations

- The green BLYC docks in the front basin, west basin, Area 8 and Eastport are for member parking.
- Do not park in docks that are not marked by the green BLYC signs.
 If the dock is empty, it means the member who leases this dock is out in their boat enjoying Buckeye Lake!
- There is no overnight parking in transient dockage.
- These docks are for the use of BLYC members only. They are not for friends meeting you at the Club. This is not public docking.
- You are welcome to sit on your boats, but all food and drink consumed must be purchased at the Club. Bringing alcohol on the island and club property is a violation of our liquor license.
- You need to come on the island and go to one of our bars for service. Our staff will not be serving you on your boats.
- When using the outside wall for parking, remember to use the cleats provided for tying off your boat.
- Remember that the white light fixtures are not for tying off or for use as handrails. Please use the posts to help exit the boats.
- The ODNR dock is not for members

use. It is for the ODNR as part of BLYC's obligation to ODNR allowing BLYC to use their bridge to Watkins Island. Please respect this dock.

The Antique and Classic Boat Regatta

As a yacht club, BLYC supports sail and power boat regattas. The Antique and Classic Boat Regatta is Saturday, August 10 from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm. This will be the first time boats will be on display in the water since the completion of the Watkins Island project. You can walk the docks and enjoy these classics floating in the east basin, front basin, and west basin. Music for the Regatta will reflect the time of these wooden beauties! Be sure to snap a picture of what the Club looked like in years gone by and compare it with the photos of our nautical history that fill the Club.

The exhibitors will be using all the docks on Watkins Island where there is not a lift — including the BLYC Transient Docks. All dock holders will have to use the green BLYC transient docks at Eastport and Area 8 from 8:00 pm Friday, August 9 until 6:00 pm Saturday, August 10. Thank you for your cooperation that allows BLYC to continue this Club tradition.

If you are boating to the Club on the day of the event, you will have to dock on the outside wall.

Dock Use and Modifications

The docks are licensed to BLYC through the ODNR. As such, members leasing docks must have

permission from BLYC to modify any docks including adding boat lifts and cleats to planking or posts. All work must be done by a BLYC contractor, and the modification will be charged to the member. If you are interested in a lift, please complete the online dock application form and in the remarks section, give details. You must have permission before the lift is delivered. If you have a lift, and want it removed, the cost of removal belongs to the member.


Dock Waiting List

Having just returned from Junior Bay Week and now making preparations for the upcoming I-LYA Sail Regatta, I thought this month that I would share this article from 2014.

BLYC's First Voyage to the I-LYA Regatta

Shortly after her founding in 1906, BLYC's officers "stormed the Inter-Lake Yachting Association's meeting in Toledo" to make application for membership. Although, up until that time no Club had ever been admitted that wasn't on the waters of Lake Erie proper. BLYC was I-LYA's first, of now several, "inland" clubs. Now, as members of the association, BLYC's members were eligible to compete in the annual "Bay Week" Regatta at Put-in-Bay. This is the story of that first trip.

In those days, the I-LYA Regatta was a sailing regatta — this was long before the powerboating events and the Junior Regatta. Sailors from around Lake Erie would come from all "corners" — Detroit, Toledo, and Cleveland — to meet at the Bay to compete. The design of the I-LYA Burgee reflects this – three white bars on a field of blue, converging from the corners, to meet in the middle — Put-in-Bay, represented by a red circle.




Burgee of the Inter-Lake Yachting Association

In 1907, it was decided that BLYC would be represented at the I-LYA Regatta by Commodore Charles Lynch, Vice Commodore Caleb McKee, Governor T. Ellis Minshall, and Race & Regatta Chairman Guy Sackett (Commodore 1923) aboard McKee's sloop, *Floating Debt*. She was shipped via rail from Lakeside on Buckeye Lake to Toledo where McKee, along with Commodore Lynch and a friend from the east coast as crew, sailed her to "The Bay," where they would be joined by the rest of the BLYC contingent.

On Saturday afternoon, Floating Debt cleared her moorings at Toledo Yacht Club and out into Maumee Bay, headed for South Bass Island. She was warned by incoming craft to turn back due to developing foul weather. Undaunted and heedlessly, she was held to course with the same enthusiasm for which her home club was becoming noted for.

It wasn't long until the BLYC sailors were engaged in stiff competition, not with other sailboats, but with Mother Nature herself. As the day wore on, Lake Erie displayed her famously unforgiving nature as wind and waves grew increasingly ominous and skipper and crew grew quite weary of their increasingly perilous situation. While it may have been advisable to return to Toledo, the crew concluded that it would be nearly impossible as a return course would put the relatively small craft crosswise to the mountainous waves and she would certainly be swamped. The only advisable option was to hold course and ride out the storm. So, they sailed on as dusk approached and the south shore, to starboard, faded into darkness.

Near dark, a "chilling rasp" telegraphed up the centerboard trunk and the vessel jarred to an abrupt stop – Floating Debt was aground! Trying valiantly as they did, the intrepid BLYC sailors could not free her from whatever beach or bar upon which she was trapped. With sheets running free, the sails slapped viciously. Aground

and battered by waves, the vessel rolled and pitched uncontrollably repeatedly rising up and crashing back down with a "freezing shudder." Not wanting to be splintered up with the craft on an unknown coast, the crew abandoned ship. Somewhere between Toledo and Port Clinton, they made their way to shore through the darkness. Bodies and most certainly egos bruised, but otherwise safe, they took refuge on a beach for the night.

Awakened by a bright sunrise, the craftless skipper and crew opened their eyes to a cloudless sky and a gentle, rolling sea. Then, much to the crew's surprise, not far down the beach, they spied Floating Debt lying apparently intact. After considerable heaving and hoing and with the aid of swells, they finally got her afloat and sailed on to Putin-Bay. That afternoon, they hauled into the yacht-filled harbor where they were joyously greeted by a hoard of I-LYA Yachtsmen and their fellow BLYC crew, who had heard of their departure from Toledo into the teeth of the storm, and had been concerned about their unknown whereabouts and welfare.

"I was en rapport now with my surroundings and was carried on a vast stream where I felt the buoyancy of His hand who made all the worlds." Joshua Slocum, the first person to sail solo around the globe, could certainly wax poetic with the most popular authors of his time. He documented his circumnavigation feat, accomplished between the years 1895-1898, in his autobiographical book *Sailing Alone Around the World*.

Slocum's 37-foot-long sloop, *Spray*, was legendary in her self-steering abilities. He claimed that, during his 2,700-mile crossing of the Pacific Ocean, he barely touched the helm. Perhaps this is why Slocum could spend so much time writing, observing, and feeling in perfect harmony with the sea and its Creator.

Since we personify our vessels by giving them names and referring to them in the feminine gender, it might make sense to attribute to Slocum's *Spray* the admirable human character trait of self-control. An individual who can maintain a steady demeanor in the tossing and turning waves of life can accomplish much. On the other hand, "Like a city whose walls are broken through is a person who lacks self-control" (Proverbs 25:28, NIV).

"My ship was sailing along now without attention to the helm." Like the trust Joshua Slocum's was able to place in his vessel's ability to stay the course, may our Captain grace us with the self-control necessary to accomplish the purposes for which we were designed.
