# COMMODORE BILL COLLINSON

As you are aware, none of these positions are ceremonial in nature and all require a great deal of dedication and work to be successful on behalf of the club and its members. I encourage you to introduce yourself to the members of the board and to increase your understanding of their responsibilities.

We had our annual meeting on Sunday, September 22, and I am pleased to report that we had enough voting members present to meet the requirement of a quorum. This allowed us to take a vote on the constitutional change many of the boards in the past were trying to achieve. Simply, the change was to increase board authority for expenditures from \$500 to \$1,800 to put it in line with the consumer price index. This change not only provides a little more autonomy for the board but provides flexibility in the constitution to make the changes in the future based on inflationary concerns. All fiduciary obligations remain intact in that the financial health of the club is of paramount concern.

I would like to take this opportunity to share with you my goals for the upcoming year. Having been House and Grounds Governor for the past three years and working with Trustee Charlie Campbell on a number of projects before that, we have been successful in bringing a number of large projects to fruition. I am very proud of what has been accomplished. Having said that, it is time to take a bit of a breather. My focus as Commodore for the upcoming year will be to rebuild our capital

budget, reduce our outstanding debt, and improve the service at the club.

That being said, there still remains one necessary project that needs to be completed. The rear staircase at the back of the club has seen better days. We have had a construction committee working on this project for the past year. We are now at the point we are waiting for the proper permitting and anticipate that to be in hand by late October. Once received, we will start with the demolition of the current staircase and concrete foundation. A new foundation will be poured and the new staircase will be made out of galvanized steel to prevent rusting. It is designed to later add a product lift to carry bulk items up to the kitchen. It is also designed so that we may be able to attach ornamental sides to the staircase at a later date to improve the appearance of the staircase.

I want to congratulate Commodore Mike Bruckelmeyer on his successful year and to thank him for helping me prepare for the task at hand. I look forward to working with the board and the trustees to move the club forward in the years to come.

# **Four Winds, Four Corners**

As you stand on the front porch of the Club and look out at the patio, one thing that immediately captures your attention is the beautiful compass rose embossed into the concrete. The four cardinal directions, North, South, East, and West, are prominent in the rose, reminding us that we occupy a specific place on this earth. (By the way, are you aware that there are two places on the globe where you can move in only one direction from where you are standing, no matter which way you turn? When on the exact North Pole, the only direction you can go is south and, conversely, when on the exact South Pole, the only direction you can go is north. Thank me later for this useless bit of trivia!)

The various authors of the Bible mention the cardinal directions often, but two different phrases referring to the four points of the compass are used in a poetic fashion to remind readers that the whole earth is under God's purview. In the books of Job, Isaiah, Ezekiel, and Revelation the writers use the phrase "the four corners of the earth," usually when referring to the gathering or dispersal of people throughout the entire globe. Most scholars believe that the four corners allude to the farthest reaches in all the cardinal directions. They reject the suggestion that the biblical authors thought the world was flat, with corners. Instead, the "corners" could be a reference to the corners of a map.

In a similar fashion, the phrase "the four winds" is also used to metaphorically describe the whole of earth and heaven. The authors of the Psalms, Daniel, Zechariah, and Ezekiel use this expression when uttering predictions of God's sweeping judgments or blessings that reach to the boundaries of the inhabited cosmos.

So, the next time you consider a compass rose, think about the fact that God is omnipresent...the winds of His influence fill everything, everywhere, even to the four corners of the earth.

As I write this article, we are in our  $8^{th}$  week with no significant rain. The lake is almost down to winter pool levels and boaters are having difficulty getting their boats off lifts. The summer is saying goodbye and the fall is saying hello.

Just as the seasons change, changes will also be taking place at the club. This will mark my 4<sup>th</sup> year on the Board. My three year tenure as House and Grounds Governor has come to an end. These years have been a very active time for the Club as it has for me. The last three years have presented challenges as well as opportunities to improve the Club, and I hope my efforts to fulfill the obligations of the position are looked upon in a positive light. The elections held on September 22<sup>nd</sup> will result in the 119<sup>th</sup> edition of the BLYC board. My new position on the board will be that of Commodore. This excavation will require the temporary removal of the large umbrella, but it will be re-installed by the next pool season. Speaking of the umbrella, the fabric is at the end of its lifespan and will be replaced in the off season.

# A Quaint Little Drinking Club...

Among all of the activities our members enjoy at BLYC, one of the most popular is definitely having a few drinks with friends. However, this was not always necessarily the case. Up until the 1930's, the Club's bylaws had strictly prohibited alcohol on Club premises and, according to Commodore Kyle Armstrong in his 1956 book, Story of the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club, "Terms of lease of club land had always forbidden the sale of alcoholic beverages and consumption of those of intoxicating nature on the premises." It's probably safe to assume that members still enjoyed drinks with friends. But, the Club policed itself in this area, particularly in the early 1900s when public sentiment regarding alcohol was not always positive. As far back as 1916, records indicate members being expelled from the Club for violating these policies. With the advent of prohibition in the 1920s, the issue became even more troublesome. However, with the repeal of the 18th Amendment, public opinion regarding alcohol was changing and BLYC, too, went forward. Under the leadership of Commodore George Doyle, the Club applied for, and was issued a Class D liquor permit in 1933.

As it had always done, the Club still policed itself and things went along as usual. It wasn't until years later that there appeared to be any real problem. Two days prior to the Club's annual election in 1968, BLYC was cited for the sale of liquor. Apparently, for over 35 years, the Club had been in violation as the license only permitted the sale of beer, not "spirituous liquors." The Club's old D1 permit was cancelled and under the leadership of Commodore Ed Metzgar, a D4 "Private Club" permit allowing the sale of liquor was applied for and granted by the state. However, this new permit restricted some of

the activities allowed on the island — "no more raffles... no more gambling of any kind... no more 'brownbagging' of booze onto the permit premises." This permit excluded the docks and guestrooms and restricted sales to Club members only. However, BLYC moved forward and the problem appeared solved. For a little while at least...

In 1993, with increasing use of the Club by non-members for private parties and opening some events to the public, it became apparent that the Club was, yet again, in violation. Under the direction of Commodore Al Wing, the Board sought to obtain the proper D5 permit which would allow for public sales. However, most liquor permits are issued on a quota system in Ohio and, as we all know, the lake area is already saturated with such establishments. Getting the permit was going to be quite a challenge. Commodore Wing asked then-Governor John Sproat (Commodore 1996) to look into it. What John discovered was that BLYC might be able to bypass the quota on the regular D5 permits and secure a "Marina" permit. In order to qualify though, the Club had to meet certain criteria:

- The Club had to have 25 or more docks.
- The Club had to have a minimum of 2,500 square feet of floor space in the Clubhouse.
- The Club had to show that it made more money from the sale of food and other items than from the sale of liquor.
- The Club, itself, had to be located on a navigable river.

The first three criteria were easy, but the fourth? Buckeye Lake a navigable river? Diligently looking for a way to get this done, John discovered that "navigable river" is further defined in the code as any "navigable water used for interstate commerce." Buckeye Lake was originally built as a reservoir for the Ohio-Erie Canal. But in 1993, the canal hadn't been in operation for over 80 years!

There wasn't any interstate commerce happening here.

Undaunted, John found two U.S. Supreme Court cases which established that once a waterway is deemed navigable, it retains that quality even if it is no longer used for that purpose. It appeared as though we could meet the criteria. John gathered all of the supporting paperwork and, with hope and trepidation, submitted it to the State. After a difficult, even impatient, wait, not wanting to bug the State and risk the application being rejected, the word finally came down that BLYC would be granted our current D5F — Marina permit. We were now legal, but at the cost of the loss of Sunday sales. The Board went to work immediately getting a Sunday sales option on the ballot, which passed handily by a 127-75 margin in May of 1994. Commodore Sproat's diligence and legal work had paid off.

Through the years, many Commodores of BLYC have made great contributions towards the fulfillment of our Club's Mission Statement — "... the promotion of yachting and aquatic sports, cultivation of sociability among its members and the improvement of Buckeye Lake for boating purposes" — we all certainly owe a debt of gratitude to Commodores Doyle, Metzgar, Wing, and Sproat for their efforts to "cultivate sociability." Next time you're at the Club, it may well be wise to raise a glass and toast them, for without their efforts, you could not.
