Boating Season ends on November 1! ODNR regulations say that we need to have our boats out of the water at that time. BLYC will have the water turned on and the dumpster and port-a-pot available in the Eastport boatyard until November 15 for those who are putting away their boats. Please park your boats in the spots assigned to you on your lease agreement.

Membership Privileges — One of the privileges of BLYC membership is out of season storage at the Eastport boatyard. Storage can be on a trailer or on blocks from now until October 31, 2025. Yes, during boating season, the trailer can be parked in your space. The Eastport boatyard is a secure facility. Contact me at docksandrentals@buckeyelakeyc.com to reserve your storage space at below market price.

Another membership amenity is the leasing of dock space for 2025 boating season. If you are a current dock holder, now is the time to let us know that you want to continue with your dock and/or exchange docks. If you would like a dock, please complete the application on the BLYC website. Invoicing for docks is in February. We need a copy of your boat insurance and your boat registration on file for 2025 for Eastport boatyard storage and for 2025 dock rental. You can email them to docksandrentals@buckeyelakeyc.com.

There is a waiting list for each docking area (On-island, Area 8, and Eastport) and docks are given according to the rules in the Constitution and By-Laws (By-Laws Article VII and Article XI). Please note all requests must be submitted by online application to the Governor of Docks and Rentals. If you had a dock in 2024 and are not planning to lease a dock in 2025, please email docksandrentals@buckeyelakyc.com.

*Bird Control* — We have installed solar squawk boxes at the Area 8 and Eastport docks. All the boxes will be used until the gulls move on from Buckeye Lake. Even though the boats are no longer in the docks, we do not want the gulls roosting on our docks.

To keep our docks and boatyard shipshape, we have a Dock Committee — P/C Charles Campbell, P/C Jeff Hamilton, Scott Evans, Tom Reynolds, Mike Smith, Mike Fornataro, and Matt Fennen — to review all docks and the boatyard. Goals for the year include:

- 1. Boatyard cleanup including removal of all boats and trailers that do not meet lease agreement requirements.
- 2. Keeping the gulls off our docking areas.
- 3. Power washing all docks as bird blasts occur.
- 4. Identifying and repairing docks as needed

# Commodore Charles D. Lynch...

# We've been wrong all these years!

According to the plaques hanging in the fireplace room honoring all the Commodores of BLYC, and most of our lists of Past Commodores, Charles D. Lynch was Commodore for two years, 1907-1908. However, I recently discovered that he was actually Commodore for three years — through 1909.

Our first Commodore, Lawrence Sackett, was elected at the first organizational meeting of the Club in April of 1906. He only served until that fall, when he declined to run again so he could better focus on running his business. He would later serve two more terms as Commodore in 1919 and 1920. In the fall of 1906, Lynch was elected Commodore — at age 24.. Although mostly forgotten about today, he was apparently a driving force behind the early success of BLYC.

Born in 1882 in Indianapolis, Lynch was raised in Bridgeport, Connecticut where he entered the banking business after graduation from high school. He relocated to Columbus and was a founding member of the Club. At that first meeting, he was elected to be the Club's Secretary and his first charge was to draft our first Constitution & By-Laws. He led the charge in the fall of 1906 to gain the admission of Buckeye Lake Yacht Club into the Inter-Lake Yachting Association — a bold move as no club that wasn't on the shores of Lake Erie had ever been admitted — and was elected to their Board of Trustees that same year. He was a member of the crew of Floating Debt, Caleb McKee's sloop, that sailed a fateful trip from Toledo to Put-in-Bay for the I-LYA Regatta in 1907 — a story which I shared again just a few months ago. He spearheaded the campaign to build our first Clubhouse

in 1907 and was a founding member of the Buckeye Lake Building Company that funded the effort. After serving as Commodore of BLYC, he was elected Rear Commodore of I-LYA in 1910 and Vice Commodore in 1911. It is not known why he never moved up to become I-LYA Commodore. He had, at that time, relocated back to Indianapolis and one might presume that distance alone prevented him from being able to assume the duties of the office. It would be another 25 years before a BLYC member would lead I-LYA. (Edgar T. Wolfe — 1937) In 1914, he moved to Detroit and became a member of the esteemed Detroit Yacht Club. DYC Historian. P/C Edwin Theisen, informs me that their records show that Lynch was very active at DYC in the early part of the twentieth century and an integral part of their race committee. He apparently never held an office, at least not that of Commodore, in the Club, however. He was a successful businessman in Detroit and highly respected for his leadership and integrity. He also remained active in I-LYA for many years to follow. In December of 1916, he helped to

form the Inter-Lake Yachtsmen's Fund

 the charitable foundation associated with I-LYA that provides funding for youth sailing, racing, and boating education and safety throughout our region — and was elected their first President. BLYC members continue to served on this board to this day and several of our members are also life endowment members of the Fund. Lynch was also very active in the Amateur Athletic Union (AAU) and served on the U.S. Olympic Swimming Committee for both the 1920 (Antwerp) and 1924 (Chamonix) games. It is without question that he was a leader in yachting and aquatic sports throughout his lifetime. He even holds a U.S. Patent for a "flexible staff holder" used to display flags on boats — presumably for race committee signals.

Lynch's service to BLYC, however, was of particular note. Upon his "retirement" as Commodore in the fall of 1909, having ably led the Club through its infancy, he was presented a silver loving cup in appreciation of his service. The following summer, he would relocate to Indianapolis. The Club held a farewell party on Beech Island in his honor. The speaker for the event was "Uncle George" Watkins, President of the State Board of Public Works, and the man for whom our island is now named. In his remarks, Watkins thanked the Club, and Commodore Lynch in particular, for their efforts in getting needed improvements made at Buckeye Lake. He then presented Lynch with a solid gold watch chain and fob bearing the Club emblem "as a slight token of the very great esteem in which the club members and their friends at large hold him."

It is not known what became of Commodore Lynch in later years. His name appears in the 1948 BLYC membership directory, having remained a member of the Club he ably led in his younger years, presumably until his death.

# **Squanto Sails the Atlantic**

As schoolchildren we learned about Squanto, the native American Indian who assisted the Pilgrims as they struggled to establish their settlement in Plymouth after losing nearly half their numbers over the first winter. But few know how God uniquely prepared Squanto for this role in the years leading up to his time with the Pilgrims. Did you know Squanto crossed the Atlantic four times prior to meeting the settlers in Plymouth? It's quite a long story with many details, but I'll try to be concise.

Not once, but twice, Squanto had been taken captive by English traders and transported to Europe where he learned the English culture. The first time was in 1605 when Captain George Weymouth kidnapped Squanto and four other natives and took them to England against their wills. They were taught English so they could be questioned about the tribes that populated New England and about suitable places to establish colonies. Nine years later Squanto sailed back across the Atlantic with Captain John Smith (yes, Pocahontas' friend) who returned Squanto to his home and tribe, the Patuxets.

Sailing with the Smith expedition on another ship was Captain Thomas Hunt, who stayed behind in New England after Smith departed, presumably to continue trading with the natives. But Hunt had a more nefarious and profitable plan. Once Smith was gone, Hunt tricked Squanto and several other natives onto his ship, put them in irons, and hauled them back across the ocean, this time to Spain with the intention of selling the Indians as slaves. Squanto was bought and rescued by some friars from the local monastery who taught him the Christian faith. God was readying Squanto for his future with the Pilgrims.

After a while Squanto left the monastery and made his way back to England where he met Captain Thomas Dermer who agreed to take Squanto with him on his next voyage to New England. When Squanto arrived home six months before the Pilgrims landed in Plymouth, he discovered to his dismay that his entire tribe had been wiped out by disease. Dejected, Squanto went to live with a nearby tribe, the Wampanoags, and their chief, Massasoit.

Word came the next spring that a peaceful group of English settlers had arrived and were struggling to establish a colony. Squanto's friend, Samoset, had met these Christian "pilgrims" and discerned that Squanto might be able to help them. The rest is history.

Plymouth Governor William Bradford later remarked that Squanto was "a special instrument sent of God for their good, beyond their expectation." Squanto could not have been sent had he not first been prepared for the role through many tribulations. God's ways are sometimes mysterious, but they are always wondrous to behold!
