DOCKS & RENTALS

Invoicing: February is the beginning of the boating season at BLYC. Many of you are off to look at new boats at various boat shows while others are making summer boating plans. Invoicing for docks and the Eastport boatyard are in the mail! Remember to send in copies of your boat insurance declaration page and your boat registration with your payment. Both are required by BLYC's insurance carrier. If you are storing a boat in Eastport, sign and return your lease agreement as well.

Dock Waiting List: If you are interested in a dock at BLYC, complete the online application on the website. You will be assigned a dock according to the BLYC guidelines set forth in the Constitution and By-laws. We do have docks available and have assigned docks to most of the people on the waiting list.

New Locks: On February 1, 2025, new locks were installed on the Eastport boatyard gates. If you dock at Eastport and/or have boats stored at Eastport boatyard you will receive the combination by email as we receive your payment and paperwork. All of the first responders around the Lake were sent the code. If you are interested in boat and trailer storage, complete the online application on the website.

Removal of Derelict Boats in the Eastport Boatyard: The ODNR has a list of all derelict boats in Eastport and will be inspecting them as the snow melts and the temperatures are above freezing. We have contracted to have them removed once the boat owners are contacted.

Ghost Boat Update: The captain of the "Ghost Boat" has been identified and is working with the Club to acquire a parking space.

Thin Ice: The ice around Watkins Island and all of our docks could be thin. Accessing the lake from our docks is prohibited.

RACING RULES UPDATE

Every four years, following the Olympic Games, World Sailing updates the Race Rules of Sailing for the next four years. The new 2025-2028 Racing Rules were published last month and are now available through US Sailing's mobile app. The printed rulebook should be available later this month through the website, www.ussailing.org.

With each quadrennial change, there are inevitably new rules and restrictions that come about. This year, most are clarifications rather than changes. We will review these as a part of our annual Racing Rules seminar next month. But, for the purpose of a "teaser," here are what I see as some the key changes with this rule book...

- Rule 14 Avoiding Contact This rule, perhaps one of the most imporant (IMHO), now has added restrictions on a boat's actions that may lead to contact as well as the boat making contact itself.
- Rule 18 Mark Room This has always been a difficult, even confusing, rule and it seems like it's changed frequently due to loopholes and idiosyncrasies. The most significant change this time is a clarification on when the rule "turns off," more so than to the rule itself.
- New Definitions There are changes to the definitions of Finishing, Mark-Room, and Obstruction as well as a new definition: Continuing Obstruction that may be of interest. Most of these changes are minor clarifications, however.
- Part 5 Protests, Redress, Hearings... This entire section is re-written, however it's mainly changes in how it's organized without many sigificant differences.

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Son of a Gun

Most depictions we see of life on a sailing warship during the 17th and 18th centuries lead us to believe that women almost never were permitted on board while the ship was out to sea. But in the Royal British Navy the wives of sailors, on certain occasions, were invited to accompany their husbands while their men were on duty. And even unmarried women might be "recruited" to provide certain services to keep the morale high and the tensions low among the lusty sailors.

These seafaring ladies often took up residence between the cannons, out of the way of the busy activity on the gangways. Because not all the busy activity took place on the gangways, it was inevitable that some of these females would become pregnant and give birth out there on the ocean blue. Under these circumstances it was not always obvious who was the father. So, when the birth was noted in the ship's log, a male child might be sarcastically recorded as "son of a gun." In recent years, the insult "son of a gun" has softened in its negative implications and is simply used as an expression of surprise or as a label for a cunning rascal.

Certainly, the circumstances around Jesus' birth were mysterious if not scandalous. When Mary, His mother, was found to be with child she was not yet married to Joseph. The Gospels do not record what kind of gossip she and Joseph had to endure. If Mary or Joseph tried to explain how it was that she was "found to be with child by the Holy Spirit" (Matthew 1:18), their words were most likely met with skepticism or ridicule. Their detractors probably called the Son of God something like "son of a gun" or worse.

What's the lesson in this? Perhaps we should pause and consider whether it is wise for us to quickly label people or jump to conclusions when we do not know the entire story behind their difficult or unusual circumstances. In most cases, we'd probably regretfully exclaim "Well I'll be a son of a gun!" once we heard the full details.

LOOKING AFT

As Commodore Limes points out, we owe a debt of gratitude to Commodore Armstrong for *the preservation of BLYC's rich early history.* Without his efforts, much would have been lost to time. The End of an Era

P/C Whitey Limes May, 1980

At 1815 hours on October 26 1974 an Era came to an end at Buckeye Lake. Commodore Kyle Armstrong and his Lyman sailboat left Buckeye Lake and Buckeye Lake Yacht Club.

The reader will say "What is so strange about a man and his boat leaving the Yacht Club?" This was not just another man and his boat, it was Commodore Kyle Armstrong and his sailboat Josy.

Kyle Armstrong joined Buckeye Lake Yacht Club in 1920. In 1941 he was elected to the Board of Governors. He became Rear Commodore in 1945. During his tour of duty as Vice Commodore in 1946, Commodore Armstrong in his own words, "had never seen a copy of the Constitution and By-Laws of Buckeye Lake Yacht Club." The last published edition was in 1933, and, since then, both had been amended several times. As a result few of the members and the Officers were familiar with the Club's operating laws. This, to say the least, created problems in solving any difficult situation that might arise, which needed Constitutional and By-Laws rulings.

With this in mind Commodore Armstrong took it upon himself to research and assemble the articles of the two documents which would be up to date. The result was published in the Constitution and By-Laws of BLYC as amended to March 8, 1946.

-SGH made in both the By-Laws and the Constitution. The latest being in 1969 in the Constitution and in 1971 in the By-Laws. [Ed note: many more since]

> Kyle Armstrong was elected Commodore of BLYC in 1947. Commodore Armstrong was awarded the Heber Award in 1954. In 1939 while Kyle Armstrong was just an active member of the Club, a new fleet of 5 small sailboats was added to the sailing fleet of BLYC. This small sailboat was known as the Lyman Cat. The specifications were, 15 ft. long X 6 ft. beam, displaced about 450 pounds and carried 143 sq. ft. of sail. A far cry from the big K Cats which displaced 2000 pounds and carried 270 sq. ft. of sail. Kyle Armstrong purchased one of the small sailboats, christened it Josy and launched her in July 1939. Josy and her skipper became the sixth member of the fleet, which grew to seven members and competed amongst themselves until 1945 when the Lyman class fleet for one reason or another finally disbanded. Josy and her skipper stayed at Buckeye Lake.

Now let me tell you about Josy...

For many years, those years that the writer has known of, a common expression around BLYC was, "The sailing season is open. Kyle Armstrong is refinishing Josy. In a short while, one would see *Josy* in her slip in the back basin, alongside the bridge, swaying to and fro in her mooring. Like an anxious child wanting to play. Her cat boat rig was a familiar sight on Buckeye Lake.

Under the steady hand and skillful sailing Since then several amendments have been of Commodore Armstrong, Josy probably

sailed into more "bays", "inlets" and "channels" than any other one boat. In all probability it was from the cockpit of *Josy* that Commodore Armstrong made his notes, soundings and measurements of the lake from which he made the chart of the lake, a coy of which hangs on the wall of the "Gobs Mess" at BLYC.

Time has a positive way of overtaking things, boats and humans alike. The sailing season of 1972 was the last year that *Josy* and her familiar skipper plied the waters of Buckeye Lake. During the next two seasons Josy did not sail.

In a short talk with Commodore Armstrong on 26 October 1974, he intimated, with tears in his eyes, to the writer, that his hearing had worsened, his eyesight had failed to the extent that he could no longer read newsprint and that his memory was not what it should be.

What has become of *Josy* is not known. She was to be refinished during the winter months of 1974-75. If she is still afloat, let us hope she is still the proud little Lyman Cat she was at Buckeye Lake. No parent ever fondled a child with more loving hands than Commodore Kyle Armstrong with *Josy*.

Commodore Kyle Armstrong passed away on 7 March 1976.

The above are just a few thoughts that occurred to a sentimental old fool, who, when he saw Commodore Armstrong and Josy leave Buckeye Lake, likes to believe that old sailors never die, they just sail over the horizon into the sunset."


