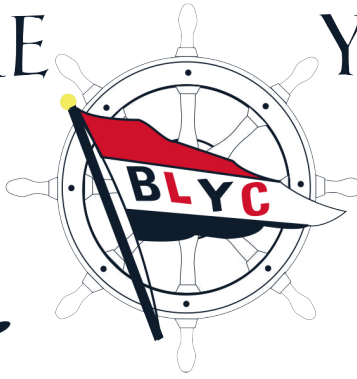

March has finally arrived and Old Man Winter is releasing his frigid grip on the shores of Buckeye Lake. The slow period for the club is coming to an end, and we expect the activity at the club to increase exponentially in the next few months.

Along with increased activity, there is more pressure put on Bar and Kitchen to deliver high quality service and product in a timely manner. The Board has been reviewing our operation, and one of the solutions is to spread reservations/orders out more evenly.

The problem we are experiencing is that, although most reservations are made from 5:30 to 8:00, most members tend to place dinner orders between 7:00 to 7:30 resulting in an overwhelming number of orders at one time.

Our kitchen's capacity is currently about 20 meals within a 15-minute time period. This equates to about 80 meals in an hour. The kitchen in any restaurant works

like a well-oiled machine. Orders come in, food is prepared, and plates are sent out in a rhythm that keeps everything running smoothly. When diners delay their orders, this flow is disrupted. A late order can back up the kitchen, affecting everything from the speed of preparation to the quality of the food served. Even a mere 20 minute delay can make a big difference.

What we are considering (to avoid this backup) is to request that if you make a reservation for 6:00 pm, you place your food order within 30 minutes.

No one likes to wait for their beverage or meal, and if we all work together ordering our meals closer to our reservation times, it should go a long way to reducing wait times.

I would very much like to hear your thoughts on the matter. Remember, reservations beforehand allow us to staff and prepare appropriately.

By the time you read this article, we should be completing our work on the rear staircase. This work includes the final laying of concrete and reinstalling the fencing in the back of the club as well as around the pool filtration equipment.

For those considering renting a dock from the Club, I would encourage you to get in contact with Rear Commodore Rickie Sue Grunden as soon as possible in that we are expecting a strong demand for slips.

Brian Thom, House and Grounds Governor, will start seeking volunteers for our Spring Cleanup Day that is scheduled for Sunday, April 27, starting

Thank you to all our members who are in the process of returning copies of your declaration page of your boat insurance and your boat registration. Please send a copy to docksandrentals@buckeyelakeyc.com. BLYC is required by our liability insurance carrier to have these items on file.

Dock Waiting List — You may ask yourselves... what do I need to do to have a dock on the island? BLYC has a waiting list for all docking areas. Go to our website and complete the dock application with your preferred docking area — Eastport, Area 8, Watkins Island (East, Front, West Basins.) Consideration for a dock is outlined in the BLYC Constitution and By-Laws and are followed for dock assignments when docks become available.

Eastport Boat Yard — When your boat goes in the water this spring, what will you do with your boat trailer? The lease agreement for boat and trailer storage is for the entire year. Put your boat in the water and leave your trailer in BLYC's secured storage area!

ODNR inspected the derelict boats in the Eastport boatyard. We have contacted the owners of the 6 boats. Two of the boats are owned by former members of the Club. Hopefully, all boats will be brought up to standards required for storage or will be removed from the boatyard by boating season.

New locks will be placed on the gates of the Eastport boatyard after the derelict boats are removed. All members who have boats stored or docked at Eastport will be sent an email with the new lock codes.

Cleanup of the boatyard fence row will begin in April when we have warmer weather conditions. We are looking for volunteers to help clear the weeds and vines. It is good exercise and a great opportunity to get to know your fellow Club members. It is community service, since this will also help to make our Eastport boatyard more attractive to the Buckeye Lake community.

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

– Fleet Chaplain Mark Thogmartin

By and Large

Most folks uninitiated to the world of sailing assume that a sailboat can only be piloted downwind, going with the flow while using the rudder to make minor course adjustments. With a little experience, a novice soon learns that his or her craft actually can be pointed into the wind, as close to 40 degrees off in a boat with the right efficiencies. The sail acts as a wing, pulling the ship forward as it heels over and thrashes through the waves. Various nautical terms describe this phenomenon: “close hauled,” “slogging to windward,” “beating to weather,” or “sailing by the wind” to name a few. Whatever you call it, the ride can be wild.

On the other hand, sailing with the wind is comparatively tame. The skipper makes the sails “large,” presenting as much of them to the breeze as possible while the passengers relax and sip their wine, mesmerized by the sound of the water gently trickling around the bow.

When a ship alternatively sails “by” the wind then “large” in sails, it essentially covers a variety of directions and conditions. Over time, the nautical term “by and large” evolved to mean “on the whole” or “generally speaking,” as in “By and large, we finally made it to port.”

Most of us experience life “by and large.” In times of crisis or loss it feels like we are beating into the wind but, before long, we might be blessed with a season of smooth sailing on placid seas as the blessings of happy times fill our souls.

God can work for our good in every situation. The Psalmist framed it beautifully when he said “Thy rod and thy staff, they comfort me” (Psalm 23:4). Whether we are experiencing His rod of correction and difficulty, or His comforting staff of gentle care and guidance, by and large we will make it home, if we place our trust in the good Shepherd's helmanship.

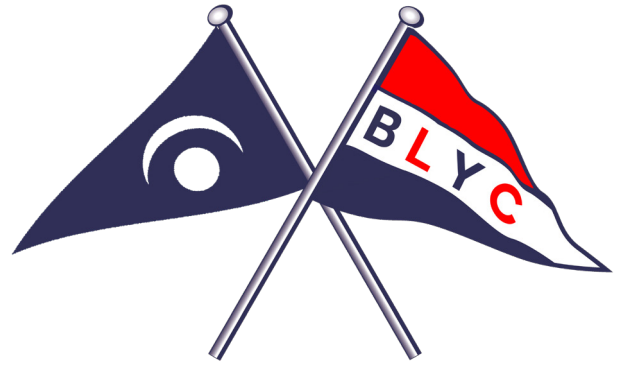
BLYC RESERVATION POLICY

OPEN DINING

Reservations are encouraged, but not required. Reservations help management assure that staffing is at an appropriate level to provide the best possible experience. If the dining area is busy, those with reservations will receive seating preference over those without. Members are always welcome. To guarantee a great evening for you and your friends a reservation is the way to go.

SPECIAL EVENTS

Reservations are a must. Our chef prepares a special menu and prepares quantities according to anticipated attendance. You may attend without a reservation, and our staff will attempt to accommodate you, seating and food quantity permitting. You may not reserve a table if you are not coming for the meal. If you plan to attend for the entertainment only, do not make a reservation. Doing so causes increased waste and expense for the club and will result in the price of the meal being charged to your account. We have no cover charge, entertainment costs are included in your dues, and members are always welcome. However, entertainment only seating is on an "as available" basis after all dining reservations have been filled.

BLYC's Fifth "Tar Social"... 1910

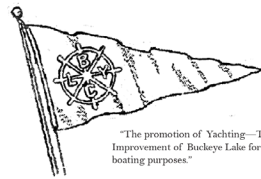
Those who have read up on the history of BLYC have certainly encountered the phrase "Tar Social" on more than one occasion. Apparently, these events were quite common in the early years of the club. A few years back, Commodore Foster wrote a piece for the *Log* about these events and deciphered the origin. While cataloging the volumes of old documents which Frank had saved through the years, I came across the invitation pictured to the right. I have digitally remastered it and plan to display it in the Cupola Room upstairs.

We all know what a "social" is. Some of us will think of church picnics. Those of us who are known to enjoy various pub entertainers both here at Buckeye Lake and at Put-in-Bay may think of a time for drinking and toasting each other. Either way, it's a time to enjoy each other's company. But, what is a "Tar?"

Thankfully, Frank did a fair amount of research on this and we now understand that "Tar" is an old slang term for a sailor. From his 2005 article...

"A 'palling' is a canvas cover used for covering a hatch or other object on a ship. Tar was used to seal ship hulls and waterproof sails. When tar was applied to a palling, presumably to make it waterproof, it became a 'tar palling.' That two-word term got compounded in time to 'tarpaulin.' Because tarpaulins were associated with ships, the word 'tarpaulin' became an informal or slang name for 'sailor.' That usage got shortened to 'tar.' So, a tar is a sailor. It's in the dictionary. If you have been around tar, you know how it rubs off to blacken your clothing and your skin. With all that tar on the sails and covers, I suspect sailors had a lot of black tar rubbed off on them. The appearance of a sailor must have made calling him a tar very appropriate."

So a "Tar Social" was a sailors' social. I assume that to include powerboaters as well. One will easily notice that there is a powerboat, and not a sailboat, pictured on this invitation from 1910. These

events were an opportunity for Club members to get together in the off season when enjoying boating on the lake was not possible. The 1910 event, held in the UCT Hall in Columbus as our Clubhouse was yet to be built, was advertised as a "Mid-Winter Regatta" for "tars of BLYC and their landlubber friends" and heralded in the press as a "grand affair."

"The fifth 'Tar Social,' held recently by the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club at Columbus, O. was some function. Ample provision was made for intellectual and physical feasting. The usual collections of verses for singing purposes accompanied the program, from which this gem of maritime mirth is extracted:

*My breakfast lies out on the ocean,
My dinner is down in the sea,
My supper is all in commotion,
Oh, back to the dry land for me.*

The "Tar Social" was a howling success."

- Powerboating Magazine; April, 1910

Although held in Columbus, miles inland from any major body of water, the evening (and the press coverage) had a distinctly nautical theme:

"The main deck of the club house was rigged up especially for the event and everything was shipshape from the quarterdeck. A bad squall was only prevented by the pipe to hammocks, for when the sailors from Buckeye Lake started their yarns the breeze blew with great force.

"The tables were beautifully arranged with miniature yachts and flowers and the colored ensigns on the walls gave the banquet hall quite a nautical appearance. The menu was printed in nautical terms."

In that year, 1910, both the club and lake were young. One of the primary early purposes of BLYC was to work with state officials to facilitate improvements at Buckeye Lake. As such, many of the speeches that evening — which apparently went well into the night — were focused on that effort.

"Improvements at Buckeye Lake were talked over and met with a very cordial response from the yacht club members. General John C. Speaks urged the restocking of streams and lakes with fish and urged the support of club members. Pledging his aid in doing more for Buckeye Lake, George H. Watkins, of the state board of public works, made the speech of the evening and he was enthusiastically cheered."

This season, we will undoubtedly have many "socials" during which members will gather, feast, and enjoy each other's company much like our predecessors did over a century ago. Once again, improvements around the lake will be a part of the discussions. There's no doubt that sailors (and their landlubber friends) at BLYC know how to hold a social. I'm not too sure about the singing though...
