RACE & REGATTA

Sailing... Year Round!

So here it is early February.... The lake is frozen. The temperatures are nearly in the single digits. What is there, then, for a Race and Regatta Governor to talk about??? Hard water sailing, of course. Ice boat sailing has always been on my bucket list. The idea of screaming down the ice at 50 miles per hour in a vessel made up of steel blades and thin wires holding it all together has a certain appeal to me.

Low and behold, on Saturday, February 6th, Dave Paligo called to let me know that Chuck Bendig, skipper of Big Girl in our Sunday Sailing Races, indicated he was going to launch his ice boat. The three of us met up at the ramp at Leibs Island and I got my first up close look at an ice boat. The first thing we needed to do was assemble the boat. It runs on three steel blades, two attached to a boom-like structure in the back and



one at the bow of the boat which also doubles as the steering mechanism. The next step was to attach the boom to the back of the boat providing the triangular support that supported the hull off the ice. Finally the mast and sail was raised and held in place by a forestay and port and starboard shrouds. The final

step for setup was running the main sheet line that controls the main sail. The boat does not have a jib which would only complicate the handling at high speeds.

So after assembling the boat and enjoying the crisp 16 degree sunny skies, that left only one element to make the adventure a go. WIND! Unfortunately, just like on our Sail on Sundays in the summer, the wind failed to materialize leaving us



stationary at the shore. Although we were unable to sail the boat on that day, it did offer us the opportunity to fine tune the sails by adjusting battens for a better outcome on our next attempt. I want to thank Chuck Bendig for providing the opportunity to get up close and personal with an ice boat. The temperatures for next weekend are supposed to be in the single digits and we have made plans to try it again at that time.

I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate P/C Steve Harris on being appointed as a National Race Officer by US Sailing this past month. There are only ~40 people with this level of certification in the entire United States! Steve has been a big part of our racing program at BLYC for years and it speaks well for our Club and our programs to have him as a part of our activity. Congratulations Steve!

Hopefully, winter weather is behind us and with this comes sprucing-up our yard. Raking, fertilizing, planting flowers, maybe a garden, and of course starting that never ending chore of cutting grass.

Although, for most of us, this is a chore of pleasure and gets us outside, it also reminds all members that club Spring Work Day, Sunday April 11, 08:30 to noon, is just around the corner. Spring cleaning of our club is an excellent way to enjoy a day taking care of our club. The bar floor tile and top of bar repair are complete. We were, however, closed for 14 days instead of 7. I will take responsibility for this as the extent of repairs necessitated the time closed extension. We added phone charging jacks and plugs to the bar. So, if your phone is about to go blank or has and your computer won't compute – just plug in at the bar for a quick fix. Our contractors, club members, and club staff made this project come together beautifully. I thank each and everyone who helped.

It is now time to start replacing the siding on the front of the club and replace the floor of the porch. We have waited for better weather and now that it is the middle of March, we are starting. We always welcome any member who would like to help. Just let Charlie know. Pool preparation for opening will immediately follow upon completion of the front of club siding and floor project. We plan to paint the pool and have a radar inspection. Painting is necessary every 3 years. The radar inspection is to determine if any voids have

occurred under or along the sides of the pool and if there are any leaks in areas we can't see. Included in the pool project will be replacing the wood behind the pool bar and refurbishing the pool bar. We plan to put our pool chairs back out if the pandemic has subsided enough for us to keep up with sanitizing. Face masks and social distancing will still be required.

During each of the above projects, we will be preparing to install a front entrance gate on the parking lot. There will be plenty of advance information prior to putting the gate into service. It is time to ensure that members get to use the parking lot – not the general public. I continually remind all members to be careful when crossing the bridge when wet. I am working with

ODNR to assist in remedying this as much as possible. So, while crossing the bridge to the club and white knuckling the hand rail, look to your right at the new lake wall and small water craft docks. Get with Governor Tobias if interested in renting one. Yes, there are visitor slips for members or guests to park their water craft, as in the front of the club, to enjoy the club for the day and leave. Visitor slips are not for overnight parking.

Please display your vehicle parking sticker for 2021. It is pink and is to be displayed on your front windshield in the lower left corner. (Left as you look out the window from driver seat)

Bowling but no Billiards, and the Best Dining Views on Buckeye Lake...

Captain Eddie Getrost was a well known citizen of Columbus, a veteran of the Spanish-American War, a Captain in World War I, a successful businessman, and our Commodore in 1925.

Born in Bellaire, Ohio in 1877, Gettrost came to Columbus at the age of 16 where he worked in a restaurant by day and attended business school at night. When the Spanish-American War broke out, he enlisted in the US Army, served in Cuba and participated in the landing at Guanica, Puerto Rico in 1898. After returning from the war, he purchased the Swift Bowling Alley on East Gay Street. Over the years, he purchased several other bowling alleys and restaurants throughout Columbus, culiminating in his lavish Gettrost Recreation Hall encompassing the second, third, fourth, and fifth floors of 44 North Front, at the corner of West Gay (this location is the site of the Leveque Tower Garage today.)

At the start of World War I, Mr. Gettrost placed his businesses in the hands of his managers and again enlisted in the US Army. He was soon thereafter commissioned as a First Lieutenant and sent to Virginia where he organized and trained a company of African American soldiers. In August of that year, he accompanied them to France as their Commander where they were assigned to the Quartermaster's Corps. While overseas, he was promoted to the rank of Captain, and was honorably discharged in August of 1919.

Mr. Gettrost owned property on the south shore of Buckeye Lake near Millersport and was quite apparently a very active part of the lake community and BLYC. In that time period, one of the more popular "off-season" activities was participation in the Inter-Lake Yachtsmen's Bowling Association. Frequently, their tournaments were hosted at Gettrost's fine establishments in Columbus.

Sadly, club records from the 1920's are scarce and, according to Kyle Armstrong's Book, *Story of Buckeye Lake Yacht Club*, there is also some question as to the manner of how officers were elected during that time. There are no records available, save the names of the Commodores, of who served BLYC on the Board or its committees. Regardless, Eddie Gettrost became Commodore, our 14th, in September of 1924.

Commodore Gettrost's elevation to the office coincided with the period of U.S. history later to be known as the "Coolidge Prosperity." Industrial production was up 70%, wages rose nearly 25%, widespread electrification improved the lives of many Americans, and by the end of the decade over half of all American's owned automobiles and other "luxury" items previously beyond their reach. The Club, too, benefitted from this era. Activity at BLYC was higher than ever! In order to accomodate this increase in participation, the Board eliminated the old "billiard hall" upstairs, enclosed the staircase, and added additional sleeping room. accomodations for members visiting the lake on the weekends. BLYC had also outgrown "Gob's Mess" (today, the bar) as it's only dining area with meal service frequently spilling over into the "lounge" (as we now know it, the Fireplace Room). The Board elected to enclose the west porch to add our current glazed-in dining room with arguably the best dining views on Buckeye Lake. As a part of this project, BLYC *finally* and officially dedicated our island in the name of the Honorable George H. Watkins who was immensely instrumental in the early developement of both the lake and of BLYC years earlier. On the evening of July 3^{rd} , 1925 – 11 years after his death



Eddie Gettrost - 1916 and nearly two decades following the Club voting to so dedicate the island - a group of Mr. Watkins' friends, along with members of the Club, unveiled and dedicated a monument appropriately commemorating this "member and and lover of the Club, friend of the common people," who "departing, left to them in Buckeye Lake a beautiful and valuable heritage to which his spirt invites us to return again and again to enjoy the fruits of his labors. He it was who made our Yacht Club possible." So originated the large bronze tablet still mounted, although perhaps somewhat obscurely, on the chimney in the Club dining

Commodore Gettrost passed away in November of 1929 following a stroke suffered at his Buckeye Lake cottage. He was 52 years old.

While bowling may not enjoy the popularity today that it once did and both the billiard hall and sleeping rooms upstairs are gone, the members of BLYC are certainly indebted to Commodore Gettrost for his leadership and vision in providing us what is, arguably, still — nearly 100 years later — one of the greatest features of our Clubhouse. Regardless of the season, is there anything better than enjoying a good meal with friends while looking out over our beautiful lake?
