If you have been to the club since March 15th, you will see that the front porch is taking on a new look. The old blue carpet, which has served well, needed replaced and has been with Trex. Trex is a plastic like planking that will last for a considerable amount of time. The exterior face of the club porch was the original wood siding painted many times. We have insulated, wrapped with wind proofing, and replaced the wood with siding. Yes, it has caused some delays in using the porch for outside dining and just sitting in one of our rocking chairs enjoying the view. By the time this newsletter gets to your home this much needed project will be completed.

I want to thank each and every one who helped with our spring work day. I have posted in the bar room a list of those who assisted. A lot was accomplished. Work day is not only a twice-a-year club tradition, but is a time that members get an opportunity to keep the club looking great. If you forgot to sign the "I helped" roster no worry, we know you were there. Again, thank you. Parking on our lot is for our members and a member's guest while visiting the club. Please display your sticker on the front windshield of your car. This year's color is pink. For your guests, please get a visitor's pass and place it on the vehicle dashboard. Visitor passes are available at the club bar. We are moving forward with entrance gates.

Last year, due to Covid-19 restrictions, we had members bring their own chairs to use at the pool. For 2021, we are going to use our chairs. As is club policy, our chairs will be cleaned and sanitized daily. If you prefer to bring your own chair, you may. The club will provide cleaning and sanitizing items for your use. Pool rules on items you can use in our pool will be followed. If throwing balls back and forth, be mindful of other members. Keep your

throwing distance short. Straws are not allowed in pool unless it can't be removed from the drink container. Follow the rules as posted. The pool opens May 28. The crane used by many to launch their boats is now removed. We were no longer able to use the crane due to construction of the ODNR dam.

The rear stairs are being painted with rust prohibitive paint. Painting will be complete by pool opening.

We continuously explore ways to keep birds off of our docks. Bird droppings cover members' boats and our docks. We are not allowed to shoot them, we can't shoo them away, they can be scared into flying but unfortunately return. However, in all cases, they "drop" on everything. Again, this year we will attempt to remedy the problem.

Rainy season is here be mindful of slippery conditions while crossing the bridge.

Welcome to Spring fellow boaters.

You may have noticed a new event in our Race and Regatta Calendar. I direct your attention to the Cardboard Boat Race and Regatta set for August 7th of this year.

The concept is that all competitors design and build their cardboard boat using only cardboard, duct tape, and paint. Your boat must be able to complete the designated course without sinking in the process. Many yacht clubs around the country stage this event as an annual reason to party and Buckeye Lake Yacht Club should be joining that group. For this year's competition, the race is open to all yacht club members and their families. In addition, all employees of the yacht club are encouraged to participate. The event is also open to our first responders around the lake — that would include police and fire. For safety reasons, all competitors must be 12 years or older and wear a life jacket during the competition.

The course this year will start at the newly constructed jet ski and kayak docks on the north end of the island, continue west, then south around the pool, then east towards the entrance to the club with the finish line being the entrance to the club. We will have two classes of boats — singlehanded and doublehanded. The only wood acceptable will be the paddles. Every other aspect of the boat must be made out of cardboard, tape, and paint.

For those concerned about the viability of their crafts, we will have safety boats stationed strategically around the course to salvage the competitors as well as what is left of their crafts if they are not up to the task.

Trophies will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place in both the single- and doublehanded categories.

The reason for posting this article now is to give you time to plan, design, test, start over again, further design, and hopefully come out with a vessel that will survive the race. All boats completing the course will be timed and the winner determined by the fastest time.

Registration will start immediately by emailing me at williamxcollinson@gmail.com. Please let us know if you wish to compete in the singlehanded, doublehanded, or both categories. This is a great opportunity to partner with your child or grandchild in what should be a constructive, fun event.

To begin your quest to build a viable boat, I recommend that you google search "cardboard boats" and or "cardboard boat races." To get some excitement generated to the event, I have added several photographs to whet your appetite.

Start your design, start your build and as always keep your bottom wet and your sails dry.
