As a member, you are welcome to bring guests to BLYC. But, as stipulated in the By-Laws, guests are only permitted to visit *with the member*, and no more than three times in a calendar year. Please follow these rules so that we have enough capacity to serve all of our members and their guests. Some events, as you've no doubt noticed, are being restricted to Members Only. This so that we can all enjoy the great entertainment and activities that our dues provide for us at the Club.

can utilize the Club. The BLYC Parking Lots are for members and their registered guests ONLY and only while using the Club facility and docks. Overnight parking is not allowed. Please do not use the lot for guests visiting your home or while visiting other nearby lake establishments. Too often, our lot is full and, at the same time, the Club is not. Towing signs are posted per Ohio Revised Code and, if necessary, we will be towing cars without passes. If you have a guest joining you at BLYC, you can now request a guest parking pass for them when you make your online reservation. Just look for the link in your confirmation email. A printable pass will be emailed to you by the Club Office. One great benefit of BLYC membership is reciprocity with other Clubs. More information on this can be found on the website under "Membership" > "Frequently Asked Questions." We also offer reciprocal priviliges to many other yacht clubs as well. However, there are sadly a few who have been abusing this privilege. While we welcome members of other yacht clubs, and we don't want to write "hard" limits on that privilege, if you know of someone who is using our Club frequently and is not a member of BLYC, please let a member of the Board know so that it can be addressed. BLYC, like all clubs, is for our members first.

Finally, the staff will be asking you for your membership number when you place an order at the Club. Please do not be offended or put out by this — it is necessary for our system to operate efficiently. In fact — you should proudly offer it... *membership has its privileges*.

Let's all work together and enjoy the summer months at the Club. They are, unfortunately, fleeting by nature.

I-LYA and Reciprocity

BLYC is a member of the Inter-Lake Yachting Association, an organization of around 140 yacht, sailing, and boating clubs throughout the Lake Erie Region.

BLYC has been a member since 1907 and participated in the annual Junior Sailing Championships every year since their inception in the 1950s including hosting the BLYC Junior Sailing Regatta last month.

As a member of I-LYA BLYC is recognized by other Yacht Clubs throughout the USA. If you are traveling, you can check with our Club Office and have them request reciprocal privileges for you. You are issued a card at the time you pay your annual dues and receive your BLYC membership card. Usually, the reciprocity is for a specific period of time.

BLYC extends reciprocity to those who are members of other Yacht Clubs. These people are expected to show the same courtesy by having their Club notify BLYC of their planned visit to Buckeye Lake and our Club. They are considered OCCASIONAL GUESTS (Article VI. Section 1(b) and as such should not be a guest on premises more than 3 times in one year.

During the latter part of May into the first two weeks of June, the club has had to replace the hot water tank, ice machine, cutting surface/cold storage table, pool chlorine injector, and other maintenance needs. Just the four mentioned items cost \$20,000.

In 2010 an engineering firm, IBI, was hired to design and explain how to fix the West pier. This explanation was tabled and no fix occurred. Now fast forward to 2017.

Since 2017, we have been focusing our major expense items on preserving the club's infrastructure, mainly the outer perimeter, where the island meets Buckeye Lake. We started with the lake wall protecting the pool side. Although, without hesitation, anyone would have said, "fix the West pier first," many factors were considered by your BLYC Board of Governors prior to making the decision on where to start. Do the West Pier, do the back of the club, do the East side docks, do the pool side. We had IBI back, consulted with various club members, discussed options with Buckeye Lake wall/ dock builders and held many meetings prior to making the decision of where to start. It appeared that our pool was headed into Buckeye Lake so the decision was made to start with the pool side. We realized that the cost to do the entire island was enormous. With this in mind, we prioritized and placed each fix into phases. Pool side was Phase I. Phase II the rear, III the East covered docks and Phase IV the front, East and West piers. At first, Phases II & III were separate but, after learning how much effort it took to get permitting for Phase I, we combined them. They became Phase II A & B.

When doing any work on ODNR property, we need a permit. ODNR defines property, "As the water in or the dirt beneath the water if it belongs to ODNR". Prior to the new ODNR dam we would go over to the ODNR Buckeye Lake headquarters, tell them what we planned to do and get it done. 5. Now, we go over to the ODNR Buckeye Lake headquarters and request paperwork to start the permit process. This is a fourstep regime, taking anywhere from one year to 18 months, to maybe get a permit or be turned down. We start with ODNR who has to approve the project. It goes to the top of

the ODNR hierarchy. They give us a letter stating we can proceed to the next level, the Army Corp of Engineers. The ACoE incorporates two other entities, EPA and National/Ohio Historical Society. All three have to issue, in writing, approval or what is needed to get approval. If no solution could be made to get approval the work can't start. There is a time limit that the ACoE permit is valid for. Our project must start within that time limit or we start the permit process all over.

The Board of Governors is now working on Phase II B, the East side covered docks. There are many issues that the Board of Governors have considered. It is always a consideration of who is affected when change is made. Sometimes, transparency seems to be neglected but, your Board of Governors thoroughly researches and discusses each item connected with a project. Every member is welcomed to offer an opinion, suggest better ways to accomplish the end goal and assist in anyway 8. they can.

Facts that led to the, "Why we are considering removing the East covered docks"

- Erosion of club property. The Northeast 1. corner of the covered docks has eroded approximately 20" in five years. Along the rotted wooden walkway erosion has taken 4" to 6".
- 2. Approximately ten years ago members tried to shore up the East covered dock shoreline with caged gravel. The cage is gone and gravel now makes a walkway at the bottom of Buckeye Lake.
- 3. The roof structure is old and needs replaced.
 - It leans towards the East
 - No maintenance has ever been done to ensure stability
 - It was not designed to hang boats weighing three thousand to six or seven thousand pounds.
- Replacing the lake wall 4.

6.

According to the 2010 engineer's recommendation it should be galvanized interlocking steel sheet pile. Properly driven into the hard pan and using tie backs for stability. Its now eleven years later and still no fix.

The dock walkways are narrow and unsecure, "wobbly", from age, water, exposure to the elements, no maintenance, erosion and use. They pose a danger of collapse or a member falling into the lake. Looks:

- The club is a magnificent showcase, it is truly the "Gem of Buckeye Lake".
- Our members like the way visible

changes are being made. Just ask them!

- Yes, looks do mean something, they mean we take care of what we have.
- The covered docks do not display themselves well. In fact, they are downright ugly.
- 7. Consideration to responsible spending:
 - To replace the covering, roof structure, would be close to \$200,000 just for the roof.
 - The following is a short list of projects we are facing: This was explained during the Fall 2020 general membership meeting. All costs displayed in parenthesis are estimated.
 - Front, East & West pier replacement - (\$500,000)
 - Replace rear stairs (\$80,000)
 - Paint club (\$20,000)
 - Build garage (\$150,000)
 - New HVaC (?)
 - Pave more of the parking lot (?)
 - Fence around parking lot (?)
 - Additional support under club (?)
 - Pool is in need of major work or replacement (\$200,000)
 - And the list goes on...
 - To spend a considerable amount of money on a roof, prior to fixing the many issues we face, needs to be placed on a waiver. The answer is yes to delay a roof.

With the outlook of enormous expense, we still have daily, day-in day-out, expenses and unforeseen costs of doing business that keep the club open. This is why we do things by priority. However, our priority list is dynamic not static. We have certainly changed this list a dozen times. It takes money, timing, initiative, perseverance and forward thinking to make our dollars work the best for the club.

In closing, having been a firefighter for over 35 years I can attest to tradition and the way things have been. The BLYC Board of Governors respects the traditions, knowledge and skills passed along from sailor to sailor, member to member of this club. Each governor holds true to the commitment of representing the BLYC members in the best way possible. Fixing the East lake wall and docks is another step in the preservation and stability of the island. When finished, the East docks will look great. They will continue to be the premiere places to moor water craft. New lake wall, electric to each dock, walkways will be steel framing with composite treads. When the governors finally vote they will do what is best for the club as a whole.

Oldies-but-goodies float their boats

Just when life at the lake started to get "back to normal" after the dam remediation, we got hit with the pandemic. This year, it sure feels more normal again and one of the traditional highlights of our summer season, the Classic Boat Regatta, is going to be back in 2021 - Saturday, August 14. Began in 1981 as the "Wooden Boat Show," the Classic Boat Regatta has been a highlight of the summer at the Club and the lake. The following is an article that appeared in the Columbus Dispatch in August of 1998 about the event. Gus Schell (BLYC Commodore, 1951 and I-LYA Commodore, 1975) had just recently had his 1948 Chris Craft sedan, Margus II, restored. Gus was a staple of life at BLYC and I-LYA for many years and a mentor and good friend to a number of our officers during his time.

BUCKEYE LAKE, Ohio - Carefully and methodically Gustav Schell untied the ropes securing his 50-year-old wooden boat to the dock in front of the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club.

The hot afternoon sun glistened off the freshly polished chrome and highly varnished mahoghany as Schell prepared for a leisurely ride across Buckeye Lake on the Margus II.

A fellow sailor stopped by and offered some assistance - with a foot pulsing against the the dock - and a kind word.

"Boy she turned out pretty," Bill Reynolds said. "I saw her in the shop when they were working on her."

Schell, 85, smiled and continued untying ropes.

He's clearly pleased with his 22-foot 1948 Chris Craft Sedan now that it has been restored by Zimmerman Wooden Boat Works on McKinley Avenue in Columbus. Normally talkative about his treasure, Schell is tight-lipped when asked how much he spent to restore it to its former glory.

"I've put more into it than I can get out of it. But it will stay in the family," Schell said. "It was starting to show its age, and it needed revarnishing and reupholstery. The engine was pulled out and dry rot

replaced. You can expect those kind of things with a 50-year old boat."

Now that the work is finished, Schell is ready for some fun.

He is looking forward to competing in the 19th annual Buckeye Lake Yacht Club Antique & Classic Boat Regatta.

About 40 wooden boats are expected for the show at Buckeye Lake Yacht Club, said organizer John Sproat.

"People really take notice of old boats," said Jay Miller, vice president of the Buckeye Chapter of the Antique and Classic Boat Society. "In most cases, you're preserving a piece of history. There's nothing like riding in a wooden boat. The way it smells, the whole experience — there's nothing like it."

"Wooden boats require more detail on the finish and must be re-sanded and refinished every year. With fiberglass, you just wash, polish, and wax," said Sproat, a Columbus lawyer who skims across Buckeye Lake in a 1965 fiberglass boat.

Wooden boats tend to form dry rot, which is not a problem with fiberglass, Schell said.

"You get a soft ride out of wooden boats. They don't bang like fiberglass boats," Schell said as he revved the engine and slice through the water towards Sellers Point.

Although the boat can reach 30 mph, *Schell said he prefers a slower pace.*

"I just enjoy going slower," he said." I don't enjoy going fast. You can only go so far on Buckeye Lake anyway."

Wooden boats, especially older ones, offer the thrill of the hunt for those seeking replacement parts, Miller said. Some restoring their boats, he said.

Others, such as Schell, pay someone to do the dirty work. Now he's ready to enjoy the fruits of those labors.

For the first time in years, Schell is entering his Chris Craft in the regatta. In the past, the boat had not fared well, mostly because it was old and worn out. "You have to keep them up and keep them clean," said Schell who joined the yacht club in 1941 and purchased this boat in 1964. "Every antique and classic boat owner cleans his boat whenever he has the chance, or has someone else do it."



After every outing, Schell maneuvers his boat into the dock. There he hooks the boat to a chain hoist and lifts it out of the water to protect the bottom from algae. A cover protects the boat from dirt and bugs.

Looks count at the regatta, where boats will be judged on the condition of the finish and the engine. The more original, the better.

"Our show is special, because we have beautiful boats set in front of an old wooden yacht club that was formed in 1906," Sproat said. "All the boats in our show operate, and they will all be in the water."

While many of the boats are from Ohio, Sproat said he has received entries from California, Florida, Pennsylvania, and Michigan.

"People who have these boats want to go to shows," he said.

The regatta is the only time the public is invited onto the grounds of the yacht club, Sproat said. Entertainment will be provided, and food and refreshments will be available for purchase, he said.

"This is a private club, but our mission is to promote an interest in boating and boating safety," Sproat said. "This is a perfect opportunity for us to do that."
