Membership Application Waiting List

The BLYC by-laws allow applicants for membership to join from October 1st through January 31st and not be invoiced for the following year. After reviewing Club membership numbers, the Board of Governors voted to open up membership for 2021-2022 on October 1st for the first 30 applicants on the new member waiting list who have completed all requirements (online application and letters from 2 Club Sponsors on file.) Each applicant on the waiting list has been notified of the Governors decision and invited to complete their membership application and remit payment of all fees. The waiting list is determined by date of application and the date of receiving sponsorship letters. Membership fees for 2022 are due on March 1, 2022. In March after the fees are collected, the Governors will review how many new memberships can be considered for 2022. The new member waiting list for 2021 will carry forward through 2022 until all that have completed requirements are considered for membership. If you have been asked to complete a sponsor letter, please forward through BLYC contact information to the Membership Governor ASAP so that all applicants can become eligible for membership. If you have friends interested in becoming members, please have them fill out the online application as we will continue using the waiting list. If you are asked to sponsor, please submit your letter by email to the BLYC Membership Governor under the "Contact Us" on the BLYC Website.

How Many Members Can BLYC Manage?

The Board of Governors has charged the Membership Committee to continue investigating how many members can belong to BLYC and the Club still give good service and provide membership comradery that is expected from a private club. The Membership Committee is reviewing dining, pool, docking privileges, and rooms for private functions to help make this determination. The Membership Committee recommended to the Board of Governors that we continue to review the number that use the Club during the winter and how many drops that we have for 2022.

HOUSE & GROUNDS

- Governor Bill Collinson

As your new Governor for House & Grounds, I will be working with Charlie on projects already in the works. If any of you have concerns about anything needing repair at the club, please let me know. I have a few projects I want to start so watch the *Log* for more information.

We are on schedule to begin the east side seawall and dock project. By October 1st all boats, lifts and anything belonging to those members renting those slips will need to be removed. Lifts will be removed by the contractor and stored on club property. Several letters have been sent to all members who will be affected by this project. Each slip space will be 24 feet wide allowing each member 12 feet. This is enough room for two boats with or without boat lifts. Electric will be provided to each slip. The dock platforms are steel with wood. Treads will be made of Trex, the same as the new flooring as our front porch.

At the same time as we are building docks on the east side, you will see a considerable amount of construction in the parking lot, on the bridge, and on our boat docks. We are installing a key-card entry system with gate. You will enter the club as you always have however, when the system is in service you will need your key-card. Our plan is to issue each member two cards. Nothing has been decided yet on how much extra or replacement cards will cost or how they will be issued. Any ideas, please let me know. After entering the club, you will proceed to a parking space either on the blacktop or in the grass area. To leave you will pull up to the gate marked exit, wait a few seconds while the gate goes up, and then exit. The exit gate will automatically open and shut. The rear gate will remain closed unless the club staff opens it. It will be operated with an automatic opener similar to a portable garage opener.

The gates at the club end of the bridge will open by using the same key-card as the parking lot. Enter key-card, gate will unlatch, and pull open the gate. When leaving, push open button, gate will unlatch, push open gate, and the gate will automatically close.

The gates on the boat docks will be push button combination locks. You will use the same combination but you must also use the combination coming off the docks as well as coming onto the docks. Gates will close automatically.

We are currently working on next years construction and pool schedule. I am open to suggestions and welcome any member who would like to assist with upcoming projects.

A Unique BLYC Tradition... indeed!

Having been involved at the Club for almost 25 years now, I've come to realize that there are some BLYC traditions that I take for granted. Case in point — BLYC Elections Weekend. A few weeks ago, we held our "traditional" election activities. I realized that, for many of our members, it was their first one. Throughout the day, I received several questions about the history of the whole affair.

It all kicks off a couple of weeks early with the candidates running for the Board putting up their signs around the Clubhouse. Then, there's Candidates Night on the Friday before elections. It is, as it sounds, an evening for members to meet those running and for the candidates to make their "stump speech" on why they are qualified to serve. I have had the pleasure of serving as the emcee for several years now. Not particularly formal - in fact, I sometimes worry that I might cross the line — it is usually a fun evening of jokes, laughter, and, of course, candidates speeches. Then Sunday, the "Porch Picnic," with candidates serving brunch to the members, elaboarate table displays, and putting campaign stickers on anyone and everyone who walks by slowly enough to catch. What other Club or organization are you aware of at which those who are volunteering to serve also provide the electors with brunch for several hours while the polls are open? I don't know of any. (In fact, at other yacht clubs to which I belong, voting is a rather anticlimatic part of a typically dry meeting filled with reports.) Then, of course, the day continues with the necessary, yet important annual meeting and presentation of the Club's highest honors, and the Commodore's Reception. It is a unique experience — for members and candidates alike — to be sure. But how did all this develop? Digging through old issues of the Log,

Digging through old issues of the *Log*, and Commodore Armstrong's 1956 book, *Story of the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club*, I think I was able to find, some, but not all the answers.

According to Armstrong, beginning with

the first election for the 1907 officers, candidates were nominated from the floor at the annual meeting. In 1919, that changed with a nominating committee selecting them in advance. Using preprinted ballots, the voting was done prior to the annual meeting. The evening prior, there were "torch light parades" and "campaign demonstrations." Not exactly what we do today, but it sounds a bit familiar. Over the coming years, one can assume that this tradition continued — a "torch light parade" sounds fun.

In the 1940's BLYC held its annual Trophy Night the evening prior to the annual meeting and elections. But Armstrong reports that, in 1948, following the presentation of awards, "the evening degenerated into a confusing babble of Campaign Night — an unannounced second feature — which went on and on well into the morning of election day." The following year, "Campaign Night" was added to the Trophy Night program as a planned event. Reading through the Logs from the early 50s (of which we are fortunate to have a few in the archives), it sounds as though it could be a rather raucous affair — "Anything can happen... and probably will." From the September 1951 issue of the *Log*,

"... it is the outstanding entertainment of the season. These candidates really go to town with original stunts beyond comparison. Be sure to be there..."

From a follow-up article in October, 1951,

"The Campaign Party was by far the biggest, the noisiest, the most successful party of the season... Many of the candidates (and members) will not recover from the impact of this party til Christmas, at least."

Sounds like maybe we're doing it wrong! But back then, the New Year's Eve Party was also advertised as being planned to continue to 2:30 am... "Cost — \$5.00 per couple; Dress — optional." Maybe we just don't know how to party like they did in in the 1950's!... Something to improve on? In 1952, Trophy Night was moved to an earlier date to allow Candidates Night to stand alone as a separate affair. From the

September 1952 Log,

campaigning. The entire Club is turned over to the candidates and most anything can happen and usually does. Votes are solicited, bought and sold. It's quite a hassle!"

But what about the porch picnic? Has it always been a part of the BLYC election festivities? There is no mention of it, or anything like it, in the early years. But, just as Candidates Night seems to have evolved from torch-light parades and campaign demonstrations, I assume that the tradition of the candidates campaigning while providing food for the members developed over time as well. The earliest mention I can find is from the October, 1965 Log in which Rear Commodore Dave Cox expresses his regrets of having been out of town and unable to enjoy the "Saturday evening... and Sunday morning activities." Perhaps something akin to what we know as the porch picnic today existed then as well. In September of 1979, an announcement in the *Log* urged members to "... come out for the Candidates Breakfast on the morning of the 16th and cast your votes." So, the "Porch Picnic" has certainly been a tradition for over four decades and likely much longer. We have a few members who were here in the 1950s and 1960s. I'll have to pick their brains and see if we can fill in some of the gaps.
