Good Day!

I want to thank our Board of Governors, Trustees, General Manager, Chef, Kitchen Staff, Servers, Bussers, Office Staff, Bartenders, Maintenance Staff and members for the continued hard work they do for the club.

The club staff and officers face many issues on a daily basis. Some are those that are designed to make the club as great as it can be. Some are those mundane, every day, nuisances that happen without notice. Some are those that take months to years to achieve resolution. Many factors enter into each issue; regulations, codes, cost, how they fit into a reasonable budget, and so on. Facing each of these is challenging but, never to a point of failure. Your Board of Governors is up to any quest that may present itself. The East dock project is well underway. There is a fence and caution tape separating the construction from the

sidewalk to the club. Please stay on the club side. If further information is needed, contact House & Grounds Governor Bill Collinson.

The club is experiencing the same staffing shortages as is happening across the USA. The club IS hiring! If you know of anyone who needs employment, send them to the club. With a shortage of kitchen, server, bussing and bartender staff there are, at times, longer than desired waiting times for bar and/or food service. I ask that you remain patient. If you make a reservation for a specific time please be prepared to be seated and order your food within a reasonable time. When a member makes a reservation for, let's say, six o'clock then waits to order with those who have seven o'clock reservations the kitchen becomes overwhelmed – Too many orders all at once. Our chef makes each order so when a table of members are being served their food, all get to eat at the same time.

Walk-ins, no reservation made or required. Walk-ins are a staple of our club. Every member, anytime, can walk into the club and be served. The bar area is always open for our members; no reservation needed at the bar. This is a great amenity, however, when coming to the club without a reservation we ask that you understand our members who have made a reservation will be served first. Again, please remain patient, you will be served as soon as possible.

There are times when a member will make a reservation and find they can't keep it. Absolutely understandable. However, failing to cancel so another member could take that table is not. The club puts on extra staff, buys more food and beverage and rearranges seating to accommodate all who make reservations. December 1st, we will be implementing new policy regarding missed reservations. Please see Vice Commodore Hamilton's article for more information.

This club is the best venue for entertainment. If you have a request for a specific band, type of music, etc., please contact Rear Commodore Bruckelmeyer.

The Board of Governors put a moratorium on allowing new members several months ago. I am pleased to say that for the October Board meeting we opened membership. We had the first reading of membership applications for thirty new members. See the Membership Governor's report for more details.



LOOKING AFT

- P/C Steve Harris, BLYC Historian

115 Years ago.... December, 1906

"... a group from the Club, led by Lynch, barged in on the fall meeting of the Inter-Lake Yachting Association in Toledo..."

Kyle Armstrong, "Story of Buckeye Lake Yacht Club"

I love this story! When I first read the above words in Armstrong's book, I thought, "Wow! That was a gutsy move." BLYC has been a member of I-LYA for many years now. Our members first attended the annual regatta at Put-in-Bay that following summer. (That's another cool story. You can find in the History Archives on the website.) But, in many ways, certainly over 100 years ago, a relatively small club of "stump skippers" don't seem to fit into the association. I-LYA was founded in 1885 by Detroit, Cleveland, and Toledo Yacht Clubs. (the design of the I-LYA burgee reflects this founding – the three corners represent Detroit, Toledo, & Cleveland. The red dot in the center represents Put-in-Bay. And, the three white lines connecting them, represent those yachtsmen coming to the islands to gather, socialize, and compete in the annual regatta.) At that time particularly, these Clubs were the "big boys" in Lake Erie sailing & boating. They had lavish facilities, large sailing "yachts," and counted among their membership the movers and shakers of business and industry in those bustling metropolitan centers. BLYC, on the other hand, was trying to carve out an existence as a yacht club on what was viewed by most as little more than a mudpuddle - an old, neglected, shallow canal reservoir that was certainly not conducive to the type of "yachting" for which these other clubs were known. We did not yet have a permanent location, let alone a Clubhouse. We certainly couldn't I-LYA is through our participation in race big boats here. And, although our membership represented the captains of business and industry in Columbus, Newark, and Zanesville, it wasn't at all convenient. The only easily accessible transportation to the lake at that time was the Interurban Railroad.

But, nonetheless, BLYC was admitted

to I-LYA – in the most technical sense, against their standing rules at the time. Since it's inception, membership in I-LYA was restricted to clubs on the "wide open and connected waters" of Lake Erie. Buckeye Lake was certainly not on Lake Erie! But, BLYC had a powerful ally within I-LYA. Commodore George Worthington had, at that time, served as the leader of I-LYA twice (1896 & 1905 – He would again serve as Commodore in 1908 & 1913.) After much discussion among the delegates, he arose in support of our small, fledgling upstart. He pointed out that Buckeye Lake, formerly the Licking Summit Reservoir, was on the Ohio-Erie Canal which ran from Portsmouth, Ohio, through said reservoir, to Lake Erie at a point very near his home Cleveland Yacht Club on East 9th Street downtown. Buckeye Lake water was Lake Erie water! That settled the debate and BLYC was admitted - only the 8th Club admitted to the Association - and our own Commodore Lynch was invited to serve on the I-LYA Board of Directors. Through the ensuing 115 years, several BLYC members have held positions in the organization – including four who have served as Commodore.

Now, understanding somewhat how the canal system worked, I feel the need to point out that the Licking Summit Reservoir was so named as it was the high point on the Ohio-Erie canal system. It provided water for much of the rest of the system. Buckeye Lake water is not, therefore, Lake Erie water. Rather, Lake Erie water is Buckeye Lake water. When I tell this story to my Lake Erie friends and point that fact out, well... Let's just say they're not nearly as impressed by that tidbit as I am.

Most BLYC members' familiarity with the annual Junior "Bay Week" Regatta. BLYC has participated every year since its inception in 1956 and BLYC members have chaired the event eight times! second only to Mentor Harbor Yachting Club. BLYC makes a strong showing at JBW. The sheer number of volunteers that we bring is astounding! But, there is much more to I-LYA than Junior Bay



Official Burgee of the Inter-Lake Yachting Association Week. Several BLYC members have served on the I-LYA Board of Trustees, on the bridge, as appointed officers, and on committees. In addition to JBW, the association hosts an annual sail regatta - now running, uninterrupted, for 128 years – the longest tenure of any event in North America, a powerboating week, and a growing junior powerboat program. As members, we enjoy reciprocity with other member clubs. The association meets twice a year in the spring and fall. At these meetings, much of the business of the association occurs, including the delegates from member clubs electing the officers and representing their club's interests in the business of the association. These weekends are not, however, just endless meetings. It is a great opportunity to meet, socialize, and network with members of other yacht, sailing, and boat clubs in our region. Friday night is all about fun! There will be several hospitality rooms and plenty of opportunity to meet other, like-minded, boaters. It truly is a fun time and a relatively short drive from home.

All members of I-LYA Clubs are also members of I-LYA. Events and activities are open to all members. If you haven't been "invited" to come join in the fun of the I-LYA Fall Meeting, consider yourself now invited. Let's make another strong showing from BLYC!
