The winter weather has caused a slow down in our progress on several projects, but the good news is we are still within our completion time frames.

To that point, we have installed the final two balusters completing our security gate set up for the parking lot. All three gates are now in place. Remaining tasks for completion include running power to the gates, doing the proper markings for our traffic flow, and getting the pass cards out to the members.

Progress on the east side seawall is progressing on schedule. While you may not notice because of the snow and ice, several large concrete platforms have





been put in place below the ground level. These concrete platforms will work as dead men and are attached to the sea wall by steel tie rods. This will prevent the seawall from being pushed out due to ground pressure. The next step is to run the power and water to the wall in preparation for the dock installation.

Since my last report, we have received our new cooler which some of you may have seen in our lobby during Winterfest. It has now found its final resting place at the bar. The old cooler gave up the ghost several months ago and this replacement will allow our bartenders to better serve our members. You may also recall we ordered a new



grill for the kitchen at the same time and are currently waiting for its delivery.

I am sad to report we had some damage on the island from the ice and snow storm that hit us in early February. Due to the weight of ice and force of the wind, the tall flag pole on the west side of the island was compromised and was in danger of collapsing. Because of the safety issue involved, it was necessary for the board to take immediate action and the flag pole was removed in mid February. The plaque at the base was saved and will be reinstalled at a new location to be determined.

Finally, the three large silver oaks in front of our house on Walnut are on the calendar for removal. These trees are extremely large and they are long past their prime. We expect their removal to take place in the next several weeks. As winter comes to an end, we expect house and grounds activity to increase, and I look forward to sharing with you those developments in upcoming articles.

Jet-14 Nationals

This month's article is not so much about history, but the future — a future event occuring right here on our lake this summer — a NATIONAL championship! As many are already aware, BLYC has been selected to host the National Championships for the Jet-14 Sailing Class Association this summer. BLYC has hosted two National Championships in the past of which I am aware — Interlake Nationals in 1994 and again in 2011. This will be the first time the Jet-14s will hold their event here.

While we've seen a number of onedesign sailing classes at Buckeye Lake through the years, most are not likely familiar with the Jet-14. While I had heard of the class previously, my first experience with them was just ten years ago at their 2012 National Championships in Lorain. A late addition to my calendar that summer, it was a great way to finish off a busy season before heading back to work for the coming school year. The Jets are a fairly small class with currently only seven active fleets, all in the eastern U.S., they're a fun, casual group and the boats are pretty cool, too. That said, they still take their racing seriously and the 2022 Nationals are sure to be competitive.

The Jet-14 design was developed in the early 1950's on Barnagat Bay in New Jersey. Sailing was becoming increasingly popular during that time, but many of the designs available had significant drawbacks - cost, speed, performance, etc. The Barnagat Bay sailors were looking for something competitive with good performance characteristics, yet easy to sail and, perhaps most importantly, something affordable and easy to maintain and transport. Thus, the Jet-14 was born. The Jet-14 is a high-performance, two-person dinghy especially designed for optimal sailing in a variety of wind

conditions. Jets are just as well suited for the flat, calm waters of Hoover Reservoir as they are for the choppy waters of Lake Erie off Cleveland. The boat's simple rigging, planing capability, and marginal cost make it both an exciting and affordable boat to sail. The first national championship was

held in 1955 has been run continuously since, with the exception of 2020. This year's event will feature 4 days of racing on Buckeye Lake — Wednesday through Sunday, the last week of July. Wednesday is measurement & registration day, along with the Women's & Juniors Nationals. At present, the time for the first race is scheduled for 1:00 pm. That evening, we will welcome our guests who will be coming from as far away as upstate New York, North Carolina, and the east coast with a cocktail party "meet & greet" at BLYC. The National Championships will start in earnest on Thursday morning with the first race scheduled to start around 10:30 am. Over the three days of the nationals, we hope to run as many as twelve races, conditions permitting. Those who know Buckeye Lake know that every day here can bring new wind and weather and we hope to provide a variety of sailing conditions to our guests over the course of the event. Thursday evening, the class will hold their Annual Meeting at BLYC followed by the Annual Class dinner. Awards are planned for Saturday after racing — likely early

afternoon.

So... you're probably thinking, "This sounds exciting. How can I get involved?" It's going to take a sizable crew to pull this event together and show our guests both great sailing and a great event. We need volunteers! We're bringing in some top race management personnel to assist, but most of the on-water race management crew will be made up of BLYC members. This is your opportunity to get involved, learn some more about sailboat racing, and have some fun while you're at it. Likewise, it's going to take an army of volunteers on shore to ensure that our guests have a great time and BLYC is known as a great place to host top-tier regattas. We need people to help with registration, meal distribution, launch & recovery of boats, local advertising & sponsorship, and much, much, more. We are fortunate to have Gov. Rickie Sue Grunden volunteering her organizational and planning skills as the overall chair for the event. I will be coordinating the race management aspects of the regatta and serve as the Principal Race Officer. If you're interested in getting involved, please reach out to one of them. You can also go online to the BLYC website, under the "Sailing & Boating" tab where you will find a volunteer interest survey to fill out. We will be in touch.

Get involved! Let's show our visiting sailors and the entire lake community that BLYC is the place to be!

PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE CLUB BY-LAWS

The Board of Governors is currently considering changes to Article I. Section 6(a). Of the By-Laws regarding NON-RESIDENT MEMBERS.

As required by Article X of the Constitution, the changes are being published in the December issue of the Log. The Board of Governors would appreciate all feedback and suggestions from the membership.

CURRENT BY-LAWS

By-Law Article 1. Section 6 (a). NON-RESIDENT MEMBERS are only persons residing outside a radius of seventy-five miles from the Club premises and not temporarily residing within the aforesaid radius for more than eight weeks during the fiscal year, each of whom must be at least twenty-one years of age: and each is entitled to the same privileges as those of an Active Member excepting Electoral Privileges.

PROPOSED BY-LAWS CHANGE

January 1, 2022-Non-Resident Members
Change the following section:

Article I. Section 6 (a). NON-RESIDENT MEMBERS are only persons residing outside a radius of seventy-five mile from the Club premises and not temporarily residing within the aforesaid radius during the fiscal year, each of whom must be at least twenty-one years of age; and each is entitled to the same privileges as those of an Active Member excepting Electoral Privileges.
