our engineering firm, IBI, is now completing the design and obtaining the necessary permits. IBI is tasked with providing the design, estimated cost, and assistance during tear out and build. Financing this project will be challenging, however, the end result will be an improvement well worth the cost.

Whether one way of financing is used or many ways in combination, the following are considerations to financing this project: borrow Funds from a local institution, issue Club bonds, increase fees, IRS Charitable designation, members donating without the possibility of an IRS charitable deduction, member(s) wanting to personally, or by a group of members, finance a certain project and a financial assessment. PLEASE NOTE: All finance options are just being considered.

A no-show for dining or an event reservation policy was instituted several months ago. Although designed to cover several aspects of why it is needed, it needed a slight adjustment. Starting April 14, 2022 the policy is:

When a member makes a reservation for dining or an event at BLYC, that member is responsible for the reservation. As long as one club member, of the persons included within that reservation, shows up for that reservation, whether for dining or an event, there will be no charge for those who do not.

Example 1: Club member reserves table for eight, either for dining or an event. Only one club member shows-up or reservation maker cancels by 5:00 pm the day of dining or event, there will be no charge for those who did not attend.

Example 2: Club member reserves a table for eight, either dining or an event. No one shows up or failure of reservation maker to cancel. Club member making the reservation is responsible for all eight. A fee of \$25 per person will be added to the club member's member charge.

DOCKS & RENTALS

Hopefully by the time you see this we will already have some boats in the water and our boating season will be underway.

Please remember the following:

- The watercraft in the rented dock must be titled in name of renter. You cannot sub-rent, transfer, or assign your permit or right to any other person or watercraft not owned or leased by you.
- Proof of insurance with full coverage is required to lease a dock or storage area.
- All items stored in the docking area must be kept in an approved docking box with authorization from the Docks & Rentals Governor.
- Any modifications to your dock must be approved in writing by the Docks & Rentals Governor and may be subject to an ODNR permit.
- Docks on on the island without lifts must vacate for the Antique Boat show (weekend of August 13th)

Transient docks for members without docks while visiting the Club are:

- D9, D10 (PWC docks in the back of the Club)
- 54, 55, & 56 just south of the pool deck and 66 (across from 54 & 55)
- 437, 460, & 475 at the ends of the Eastport 400 docks
- 801, 802, 843, & 844 in the area 800 docks.

The gates to our docks are now locked. The combination is 1906 for both sides. Please do not prop them open or force them open or closed.

As I write this article, May is just around the corner and a new boating season is about to begin. Construction continues on the east side docks and should be completed in May.



By the time you read this, the Spring Work Day at the club will have already occurred, and we will be in the process of getting the pool cleaned, filled, and ready for opening on the Memorial Day Weekend.

We are still proceeding with our activity on the security gates. All members will receive their pass cards for entering the parking lot and the club by mid-May. You will receive these cards through the mail and two cards will be issued to every member. In addition, all members will receive a "what if" card that should answer most, if not all, of your questions regarding the use of the

- Governor Bill Collinson A list of the possible questions regarding the use of pass cards are as follows:

Forgot your pass card —

Use call button on the box and provide your name and member number and the gate will be opened.

Lost your pass card —

Use the call button, provide your name and member number and the gate will be opened. NOTE: A \$100 charge will be placed on your account to replace the lost pass card.

Have guests coming —

If you have guests arriving, contact the office and you will be given a 4-digit code for them to punch in the key pad on arrival.

Pass card does not work —

Use the call button, give your name and member number and the gate will open and the card will be replaced.

Private event —

Upon making reservations for a private event, a four-digit code will be provided to you that you can pass on to the attendees and they in turn will punch the code in on their arrival.

Public event —

On days we have events open to the public, the gates will remain open. Remember once the gates are activated,

you will only able to enter the parking lot on the east drive way and exit on the west driveway which we plan to have marked accordingly. Also keep in mind that when entering or exiting the parking lot, the gate will only allow one car to go through at at time.

By the time you read this article, the

the ten-bay garage will have undergone demolition. This is necessary due to the fact that the rafters holding up the roof are rotted and create a hazard.

Chain link fencing will be constructed at the site of the 10-bay garage enclosing the parking lot. In addition, due to insurance requirements, chain link fencing will be constructed in the boat yard extending the length of the property along the dam. This is intended to keep pedestrian traffic off the stone wall and the deteriorating steps. We will be using the steps at the west side of the boat storage yard for access to the docks at Eastport.

Last but not least, construction on repairing the outdoor pool bar wall will start on Monday, April 25th, and should be finished by early May. This project will be completed in house using club volunteers.

BLYC Juniors Make History...

Forty-five years ago... the summer of 1977... Star Wars debuts and becomes the then-highest grossing movie of all time; the first Apple II computers go on sale; New York City suffers an electricity blackout lasting over 25 hours; Elvis Presley dies; the "Son of Sam" is captured; the first oil through the trans-Alaskan pipeline reaches Valdez; and BLYC makes Junior Sailing Willy, Dan, & Dan easily history!

As has been the case every summer since the 1950's, BLYC sends a team of Junior Sailors to Put-in-Bay for I-LYA's annual Junior "Bay Week" Regatta. However, back in 1977, only the Triplehanded boats sailed at the Bay, the others sailed in Port Clinton. Back then, the I-LYA regattas served as the Quarterfinals for the United States Yacht Racing Union (now US Sailing) Junior Championships. Winners from I-LYA would go on to compete against winner from other regional associations in "Area E." The winners from the Area E Semifinals then qualify for the National Championships.

In 1977, BLYC's Junior Sailors didn't just win – they won almost everything! At the Smythe (singlehanded) and Bemis (doublehanded) semifinals in Port Clinton in July, BLYC's Lon Moyer mph" – BLYC's team sailed extremely dominated the Laser fleet with finishes of 7-1-1-1-1 to easily secure his spot in the semifinals. In the doublehanded class, Steve Beeson and crew Mike Hein also easily won the quarterfinals and went on to sail in the semifinals at Cowan lake in August. The Sears (triplehanded) quarterfinals were, of course, sailed at PIB in Thistles. After a rough start in the qualifying series, BLYC's Sears team of Willy Petersilge, Dan Roshon, & Dan Dressel rallied to finish the series with three straight first place finishes to secure their spot in the Quarterfinal Championship Series. From there, they sailed strong the rest of the regatta, easily

winning the quarterfinals and continuing a strong BLYC winning tradition at that time – our fourth championship in six years! They went on to handily win the semifinals at Buffalo Canoe Club in New York against very strong competition from throughout the Great Lakes. While the conditions were challenging and varied,

won the semis and earned the honor of representing BLYC in the National Finals in Dallas, Texas in late August.

After BLYC's team's dominance at

the I-LYA Championships in all classes, strong finishes (including a win) at semifinals, numerous other sailing trophies earned throughout the season.. could it really get any better? Could BLYC make the trip to Texas and be the first midwest Club in decades to win - the first ever inlandlake Club to win?.....

The headline in the October 1977 issue of the Log reads...

BLYC SAILORS BRING TOP SEARS TROPHY HOME

Yes, they did. In conditions very different from those normally seen here at home on Buckeye Lake – winds of "10-20 mph and at times to 30-50 well. According to the October 1977 article...

"The competition was really tough but the combination of teamwork, attention to detail, sailing know-how, and sheer determination to win put Will Petersilge, Dan Roshon, and Dan Dressel in first place after the fourth race, a position they held for the rest of the series."

Beating teams from New Jersey, California, Texas, Maine, Washington, North Carolina, and Long Island, BLYC's team had won the Nationals the first, and only, BLYC Junior Team to do so.



There is a photo hanging in the Commdores' Lounge of the BLYC Clubhouse which many of us walk by often, but probably pay it no attention. It shows all six of these young men with their trophies and medals from 1977 beside a certificate from 1977 I-LYA Commodore Edwin Disch commemorating their sweep of the I-LYA Junior Championships.

Waiting List: 84 Inquiries including 3 reinstatements, 34 completed all requirements and are ready for membership when the Governors open it again in 2022. A letter has gone out to all on the waiting list that they will remain on the list until the Board of Governors decide to open up membership.

Sponsor Letters: In May 2021, the Board of Governors reinstated the by-Laws requirement of 2 sponsor letters accompanying all applications for membership when they instituted the BLYC membership waiting list.
