# CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

#### **Souls on Board**

"And the Lord God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul" (Genesis 2:7, KJV).

The BLYC Race Committee met in early April this year to prepare for the upcoming sailboat racing season. The purpose of the meeting included clarifying several of the rules competitors must follow. I had the privilege of attending this important gathering. This is inside information, folks.

One of the requirements is that each boat competing on race day must check in with the race committee prior to each heat. The spokesperson for the boat's team, when checking in, must recite the boat's sail number/name and must state the number of people in the vessel.

The committee discussed the preferred terminology related to this reporting of the number of people in the boat. It was decided that the phrase "souls on board" should be used because it's more concise, it's traditionally used in

the nautical world and, well, it has a classy, distinguished ring to it. Sailboat racing is a pretty classy way to spend a summer afternoon.

I recall a couple people on the committee wondering aloud the origin of the phrase "souls on board," so I decided to do a little research (pastors and chaplains like to talk about souls). Here's what I found:

It would be reasonable to assume the phrase has its roots in the King James version of the Bible. The Apostle Paul was involved in a shipwreck off the coast of Malta. Paul's traveling companion, Luke, authored the account in the book of Acts. In typical old English, King James jargon, Luke reported: "And we were in all in the ship two hundred threescore and sixteen souls" (Acts 27:37, KJV). The Apostle Peter, when discussing God's longsuffering patience with disobedient sinners, remarked that "eight souls were saved by water" in Noah's ark (1 Peter 3:20, KJV). Biblically speaking, souls don't always fare well in treacherous seas. Especially disobedient souls.

In slave trading days, ships were used to transport slaves and/or servants. Many people at the time did not consider these unfortunate captives as fully human. But Christian ministers believed they had souls that could be

saved by converting to Christianity. So, even on slave-bearing ships, the total souls on board were counted.

Perhaps the use of the term "souls" helps to distinguish between other forms of life or non-life that can be on board vessels like ships or airplanes. Sometimes an inanimate object is assigned a seat number. If the craft is transporting human remains, reporting "souls on board" distinguishes between the living and the dead. And if live animals are among the cargo, they may be living creatures, but in biblical parlance they aren't "souls," as in human beings. Peter didn't count any of the many animals on board the ark as "souls."

Another thought...to eliminate the potential confusion around reporting the number of passengers on a vessel separately from the number of crew members, stating the total of souls on board clarifies the human lives that are at stake independently of the roles they may be filling at the time.

So, if you come in first on race day, don't merely say "We won." Honor the humanity of the losers by proclaiming "We kicked those poor souls' butts." It would be the scripturally accurate way to report your victory.

#### **HOUSE & GROUNDS**

As I write this article, I am pleased to report that work on the front basin continues.

In addition, the race shack is complete and the sunshade at the north end of the pool has been installed.

The outer rim of the new dock structures has been completed. In addition, fenders have been placed on all the vertical dock posts to allow for safe tie up for visiting boats. Members are also encouraged to use their own fenders for additional protection. As you all know, there are times where the wave action is quite active on the lake, and tying up to the perimeter of the new docks during those times could result to damage to your boat. It is the boat owner's

responsibility to determine if it is safe to tie your boat up on the perimeter docks.

You will note that each post has a cleat attached to it which needs to be used to tie up the boat. The placement of the cleats are low to the deck by design which will prevent excess torque on the tie up. You will also notice that there are 3-foot high light pedestals on the perimeter docks. Under no circumstances should you tie up your boat to these pedestals nor should they be used to access or egress your boat. Doing so may cause damage to the light fixture.

If you have been out to the club recently, you are aware that we have received and set up the new patio furniture and umbrellas. In the few short weeks it has been in place it has seen a great deal of use from our members. I want to bring to your attention that two of the tables have LP gas fire pits in them. It is our hope that the furniture adds to your experience at the club.

As you are aware, the kiddie pool located south of the main pool has been closed. It appears that we have a leak in our scupper line. In order to correct the issue, it would be necessary to close the pool area for at least two weeks while the repair is completed. Given the fact that we have less than 70 pool days left in the season, it was agreed by the board that we keep the kiddie pool closed for the remainder of the season and determine its future in the fall. We apologize for this inconvenience, however, weighing the pros and cons, with such a short pool season, this was the best approach.

As you are aware, elections for board members are scheduled for this coming September. I would encourage anyone considering running for the board to contact me through the yacht club and I will be happy to discuss with you what board membership entails. It is an opportunity to have an impact on the success of your club.

#### LOOKING AFT

The past several years have not been good for one of BLYC's greatest traditions — The Classic Boat Regatta. As we all know, the spring of 2015 brough the announcment that the lake would be lowered for several years for dam repairs, effectively ending boating at Buckeye Lake until the 2019 seaon. This, of course, was followed by the pandemic, then the removal of our old covered docks which housed several of the classic boats of BLYC members, and finally the loss of all on-island docking last summer for the long overdue replacement of all docks.

This year, Chris Hebert and his committee are diligently working to revive this long-time BLYC and Buckeye Lake tradition. This seemed like a good time to reprint this article, first published in the July 2012 issue of the Log.

#### **BLYC's First Classic Boat Regatta**

*In the late 1970's and early 80's, sailboat* racing was king at BLYC. If one peruses the old issues of the Log available on the BLYC website (Thank you P/C Frank Foster, III for making these available), it's easy to see that most of the Club activity at that time centered around sailboat racing and social events. There just doesn't seem that there was that much geared towards our power-boating and non-racing members. In 1981, BLYC's 75th Anniversary year, that changed... It was first announced in the December, 1980 Log by Race & Regatta Governor Gordon Forster that a new weekend activity was being developed...

"An invitational classic and antique WOODEN power and sail boat regatta." The first chairman was P/C Ed Metzgar. The entry fee was \$20 per boat and 28 boats participated. According to the post-event write-up in the Log...

Commodore Iim Dressel, committee members and entrants were more than pleased after launching the first, of what's hoped to be many, antique boat contest.

The weatherman cooperated by bathing the north shore area with plenty of sun, perfect to bring out the patina of lovingly cared-for mahogany, gleaming chrome and mellow brass.... Last minute scurrying before judging found them polishing hulls and wiping Sadly, since the original publication telltale finger and foot marks from chrome hardware and touch-me-notdecks.

*In the past 30+ years, the show has* certainly evolved. The name has changed, it now includes classic nonwooden boats, and each year may bring different types of boats and participants from different parts of the country. But, it doesn't sound like that much has changed. Every year since 1981, BLYC has hosted this highlight event of our summer season and, just as in that first show, nervous boat owners clean & polish and prepare their pride-and-joy crafts for judging and the admiration of spectators.

At the 1981 event, the "Best of Show" Trophy went to Mrs. Zenna Sayre for her 1928, 26' triple cockpit Chris Craft Runabout, Cherokee. The First Place trophy for "Nearest to Original Condition" went to Phil Schell for a 1948 Chris Craft Sedan, Margus II. If I'm not mistaken, both of these families have had boats in every Classic Boat Regatta BLYC has hosted. And... 1981 wasn't the only time they've taken home well-deserved trophies.

Other BLYC member earning trophies in 1981 included Mrs. Nancy Benson, 1st Place "Oldest Restored," for her 1928 Chris Craft Runabout and P/C Gus Schell, "Sailboat Special Award," for his 1931 Ludke "K" Boat, Cat's Paw. I'm pretty sure that both boats are still

around Buckeye Lake, although I know that the years have taken their toll on Cat's Paw. She is one of the last "K" boats remaining of what was once one of the premier sailing fleets in this region.

of that article, Cat's Paw deteriorated beyond repair and was scrapped. However, there are still many classic and antique boats around BLYC and the lake. I'm sure that P/Cs Ryan will continue the tradition of the Sayre boats entering the event — he is the current owner of Squawman — and several other members will certainly bring their boats as well. This year's Classic Boat Regatta will be held the weekend of August 9-10. Just as in 1981, it will certainly be a highlight of our summer season. Not only is this a great event for our members, it is also a time when we have the opportunity to show off our great Club to the public at large. Make plans now to attend, participate in, or volunteer for this great **BLYC** tradition!

## **DOCKS & RENTALS**

Coming to the Club by boat is one of our finest traditions! The biggest issue is whether a transient dock will be available. Look for the green BLYC signs at Watkins Island, Eastport, and Area 8! There are only 3 slips in the front basin that are leased by our members. The Board of Governors decided to open the other front basin docks as transient docks, and those are marked with the green BLYC signs. This will give all our members an opportunity to boat to the Club.

Please note that there is a change in the configuration of the docks in the front basin. The Club is on an island. To get construction materials and large kitchen equipment to the island, it needs to come by barge. The front basin expansion allows us to park a barge without disturbing any docks. We also have green BLYC signs at the end of Area 8 and both Eastport piers. At Eastport there are several green BLYC signss on the west pier. As we move boats back to the west basin, we will create more transient dockage at Eastport.

#### **Transient Docking Rules**

- There is no overnight parking in Transient Docking.
- These docks are for the use of BLYC members only, they are not for friends meeting you at the Club.
- You are welcome to sit on your boats, but all food and drink consumed must be purchased at the Club. Bringing alcohol on the island and into our docks is a violation of our liquor license.
- You need to come on the Island or go to one of the bars for service. Our staff will not be serving you on your boats.
- The ODNR dock is not for members use. It is for the ODNR as part of the Clubs obligation to ODNR allowing BLYC to use their bridge to Watkins Island. Please respect this dock.

Name Plates on Island Docks: We appreciate all that those who dock on Watkins Island have endured during the construction project. In appreciation of your patience, the Construction Committee gave all who had paid in April name plates. The signs with three silver stars recognize our Past Commodores. We hope you enjoy them.

Racers Row: We are a Yacht Club and have an active sailboat racing group and a very active junior instruction program. Did you know we have "Racers Row" where these magnificent boats are docked at Eastport? It is a beautiful sight from the lake!

Classic Boat Show: Another of BLYC's time honored traditions is the Classic Boat Show which is returning on Saturday, August 10. All boats on Watkins Island will be temporarily docked at Eastport from Friday, August 9 to Sunday, August 11 at 9:00 am for the show. This is open to the public, and it will be one of the biggest antique boat shows in central Ohio. Thank you in advance for welcoming our guests to the Classic Boat Show and moving your boats for the show.


