One of the great traditions of the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club is coming to the island by boat for swimming and dining! All transient (courtesy) docks on the island, Eastport, and Area 8 are marked "BLYC" on signs. Since there is a commercial bar and grill next to Watkins Island, we chose to mark them BLYC instead of "transient." These docks are for members visiting the Club. We don't want non members thinking it is okay to tie up here and go next door. An empty dock only means that someone is enjoying a boat ride on Buckeye Lake! Please respect their space.

CHAPLAIN’S CORNER

The Bitter End

If you have the desire, the time, and the means, you can book a fun-filled, nautically-themed vacation at the *Bitter End Yacht Club* in the British Virgin Islands. The amenities are situated right on the Caribbean shore, and an abundance of watersport activities beckon to those who desire to learn and/or play in the maritime breezes. So why would such an idyllic place have the word “bitter” in its name?

As you probably guessed, the term “the bitter end” has nautical roots. On the deck of wooden sailing ships were posts called “bitts,” made of wood, around which the end of an anchor rope, chain, or cable is secured. As a sailor paid out the anchor rode, if the water where the ship’s captain wished to moor was deep, the line eventually came to the very end, or the “bitter” end. Obviously, more anchor line needed to be added, or the captain ordered the ship’s crew to seek shallower water.

Over the years, the term “the bitter end” has evolved to mean coming to the final conclusion of a matter, experiencing a situation to its fullest extent. Perseverance is required. Because the word “bitter” has negative connotations, most people who use the phrase nowadays are implying that the experience has been difficult, as in the comment “We sat through Bill’s boring presentation to the bitter end.”

The Apostle John, in his gospel, makes an interesting observation about Jesus, who would soon be crucified: “Jesus knew that the hour had come for him to leave this world and go to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the world, *he loved them to the end*” (John 13:1, NIV). In another place, John quotes Jesus as saying, “Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends” (John 15:13, ESV). The affection Jesus expressed for His people as He suffered on their behalf was anything but bitter, even though the circumstances around the end of His life were gruesome.

Why a Junior Program?

Recently, I-LYA Historian Tom Thanasiu shared a booklet with me that he uncovered in the archives of the Great Lakes Museum in Toledo — The Inter-Lake Junior Yacht Racing Association Manual. Although junior sailing programs had certainly existed previously, the 1950s was a time of growth and interest in youth sailing. It was also during this time that BLYC juniors began a decades-long domination of the sport. Starting in the early 1950's and for many years after, BLYC junior sailors not only competed around the region, but they also brought home many trophies from I-LYA Junior Bay Week and other championships. Those trophies were not just for sailing, however — equally as important, BLYC juniors have also won numerous times for Individual & Team Sportsmanship and Shipshape!

Today, our program is, undoubtedly, in a rebuilding phase. Last year, for the first time in the history of the event, BLYC did not have competitors at Junior Bay. As interest begins to grow, and we begin another season, I thought I'd share the following from that 1954 Junior Sailing Manual...

Why a Junior Program?

This question, asked many times by club members, is easily answered. Of the many reasons, the three major ones are: to teach water safety, to teach self-assurance and leadership, and to provide beneficial recreation.

You would not fly without first taking lessons — in fact, the law will not allow you to — nor would you swim or drive a car without instruction. Actually, there are very few recreations you would or could enjoy without first learning the fundamentals. In a sport such as yachting, where so many complex situations arise and there are so many factors beyond your control, it is only through teaching and experience that disasters are averted.

It is a known fact that the Navy and Coast Guard, in the last emergency, largely credited those young men with previous training for our speed and thoroughness in organizing and manning the Nation's seas.

Experience through the years has shown that those clubs who have had Junior organizations have prospered and remained a well knit organization. Theirs has been a family club. A great many of their Flag Officers received their training in their Junior organizations.

I know of no recreation that offers so much and holds the interest so well as yachting. It gives us a healthy outdoor sport, while building character by developing alertness, assumption of responsibility, concentration, initiative, promptness of decision and self-reliance.

We don't yet know if BLYC will have a racing team this year. But one thing is for certain — starting this coming week, we will again teach youth skills that help to build character and make them self-reliant. That's better than any trophy!

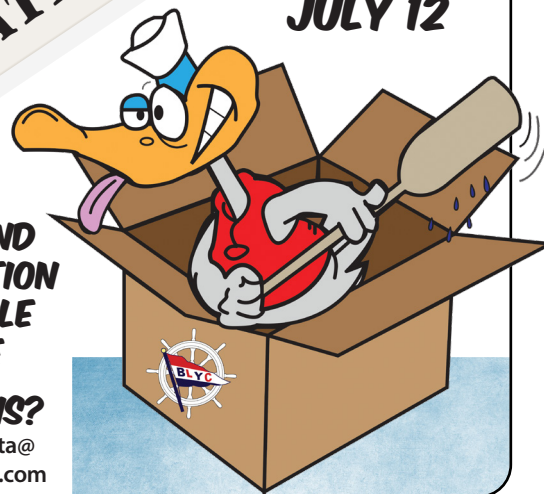

OPEN DINING

Reservations are encouraged, but not required. Reservations help management assure that staffing is at an appropriate level to provide the best possible experience. If the dining area is busy, those with reservations will receive seating preference over those without. Members are always welcome. To guarantee a great evening for you and your friends a reservation is the way to go.

SPECIAL EVENTS

However, entertainment only seating is on an "as available" basis after all dining reservations have been filled.

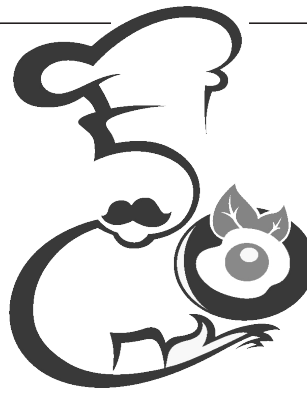

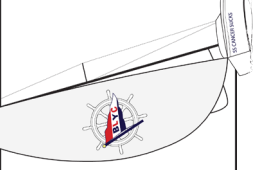
