and tie them to the dock to prevent scratching and rubbing against the dock.

Things do happen. This year we had a boat get loose during a storm and another boat sank to the bottom in the dock and caused an oil spill. The ODNR required the owner of the sunken boat to remove it that day. Make sure you send in your declaration page of your boat insurance as it renews this summer.

BLYC RESERVATION POLICY

OPEN DINING

Reservations are encouraged, but not required.
Reservations help management assure that staffing is at an appropriate level to provide the best possible experience. If the dining area is busy, those with reservations will receive seating preference over those without. Members are always welcome. To guarantee a great evening for you and your friends a reservation is the way to go.

SPECIAL EVENTS

Reservations are a must. Our chef prepares a special menu and prepares quantities according to anticipated attendance. You may attend without a reservation, and our staff will attempt to accommodate you, seating and food quantity permitting. You may not reserve a table if you are not coming for the meal. If you plan to attend for the entertainment only, do not make a reservation. Doing so causes increased waste and expense for the club and will result in the price of the meal being charged to your account. We have no cover charge, entertainment costs are included in your dues, and members are always welcome. However, entertainment only seating is on an "as available" basis after all dining reservations have been filled.

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Overbearing

If you are a fan of the seafaring novel *Master and Commander* by Patrick O'Brian (which was also made into a movie starring Russell Crowe) you are probably familiar with the nautical term "bearing down." When one sailing ship is sailing downwind, or bearing down, toward another in pursuit or close battle, that pursuing ship's sails are, effectively, stealing or diverting the wind from the ship ahead, causing it to lose speed or forcing it to change course. This is also called "overbearing" because the vessel that is bearing down is dominating "over" the wind supply of the other.

The application to human behavior is obvious. How often does a domineering person's actions "take the wind out of the sails" of others who may disagree with him or stand in his way? Overbearing individuals often are pushy or intrusive, and they simply demonstrate a lack of consideration for others. They may frequently win in verbal battles, but they lose respect and influence in the long run.

The need to be overbearing is only necessary in times of war or competition, or when protecting innocent lives. Otherwise, kindness and humility, with a touch of persuasiveness, is the best tactic. We are encouraged in the New Testament to "Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves" (Philippians 2:3, NIV). Many unnecessary conflicts and broken relationships can be avoided by heeding this advice.

LOOKING AFT...

The Ohio & Erie Canal

Just this past month, The Ohio History Connection and several other history organizaitons around Ohio celebrated the 200th Anniversary of the groundbreaking for the Ohio-Erie Canal. As you probably know, the reservoir that has come to be known as Buckeye Lake, was built to provide locking water for said canal. What many probably don't know is that the actual anniversary is on July 4th. Many of you have, no doubt, passed the location of the groundbreaking — known then as "Licking Summit" — many times as you drive from the lake on State Route 79 into Heath. The historical marker located there reads:

At this site on July 4, 1825, Governor DeWitt Clinton of New York, a Master Mason, turned the first shovelful of earth for the Ohio Canal...

This summer, I've been exploring some of our Ohio Canal history. If you haven't done so, I highly recommend you take some time to visit Roscoe Village in Coshocton and the Canal District in Newark, along with other sites around the state. It's well worth your time. In celebration of this bicentennial, I share the following article, originally published in the Log in February, 2015, detailing one story of the canal days here at the lake.


The Wreck of the Black Diamond

Many are familiar with the Gordon Lightfoot song, *The Wreck of the Edmund Fitzgerald*. It seems that most bodies of water have their own famous sinkings. Believe it or not, Buckeye Lake is no exception. The following story is condensed from Joseph Simpson, Jr.'s *The Story of Buckeye Lake*, published in 1912.

In 1850, Mr. Simpson, Sr. of Somerset operated a "steam grist mill" near Thornville. Previous owners of the mill had been unable to make a go of it, primarily due to the cost of wood as fuel. Mr. Simpson, deciding to try his hand at making the venture profitable, ordered two boat loads of coal from the Hocking Valley, to be delivered by canal boat to Thornport. In those days, once entering the reservoir at the Minthorn Locks (the present location of the Seller's Point Spillway), canal boats would be towed a mile and a half along Northbank where they would enter the "channel proper." They would then be propelled by the use of long poles across the lake to their destination at the east end.

Today, we think of many areas of the lake as being quite shallow and, perhaps, treacherous. Compared to the canal days, however, the bottom of our lake is completely clear. Prior to the construction of the Licking Summit Reservoir, now Buckeye Lake, much of the area was dense forest of beech, elm, and sycamore. The area wasn't cleared prior to flooding the reservoir leaving many trees to rot at the water's surface. This resulted in a strange landscape filled with numerous hazards — stumps, dead trees, logs, and floating islands!

One fateful summer day in 1850, on journey to deliver coal to the Ohio History Connection.

Simpson Mill, the Black Diamond, under the command of one Captain Ward of Newark, entered the reservoir at Minthorn's and began the long, difficult haul across the "level" of the reservoir. She was a flat-bottomed scow with bow and aft cabins and a midship cargo capacity of about sixty ton. Loaded down to the 3-foot mark, she pulled along the towpath under fair headway, causing the line to slack and pull under a long half-sunken log. The driver stopped the mule team, but the boat, as boats do when underway, continued forward, further complicating the situation as the line pulled to the bottom collecting "a hundred pounds of reservoir moss, clinging and dripping." They got the canal boat under control, cleared the moss and continued along the uneven coast of Northbank. Such was their journey for nearly a mile until they arrived at "the fatal curve." According to Simpson, "A siren with her song could not have lured our seafarers more effectually..." Having already encountered significant difficulty and hazards, and being unfamiliar with the fact that the waters offshore were more treacherous than those near the bank, the helmsmen permitted his craft to "sheer," or change course, drifting further into the reservoir instead of hugging the shoreline. "She struck fairly and with such impact that a large hole was ripped in her bottom, helplessly impaling and allowing her to rapidly fill with water." Acting quickly, the crew was able to pull the stern of the boat into the bank and all hands safely made it to shore. The Black Diamond, however, rapidly filled, broke into two, and sank to the bottom.

For many years following, the *Black Diamond* furnished coal to the snakehunters — a term for the locals who lived along the reservoir and canal route — and farmers of the area who were willing to harvest it from the wreckage. The location of the wreckage was later to become known as "Black Diamond Bend." It appears from Simpson's maps, that this event occurred at a location approximately at what is 4100 Northbank Rd. today.

Not long after the original publication of this article, workers on the dam remediation project salvaged some of the wreckage. It is now in the posession of the Ohio History Connection for preservation. There was a piece of it on display at our local, now closed, Buckeye Lake Museum, but so far as I can ascertain, it is not on display by Ohio History Connection.
