Bird Watching

As September arrives, so often do the migrating seagulls. To counter the birds, we installed a sonic box that emits attacking eagle sounds that scares away the gulls on Watkins Island, Eastport, and Area 8. If you are at Area 8 and Eastport, we recommend that you dangle shiny discs that move in the wind from your boats. We also are installing another hawk on Area 8.

Have you planned for winter boat storage? The storage in the Eastport boatyard is an annual fee and includes trailer storage during the boating season. Eastport is a secure facility, and you have the combination. CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Scuttlebutt

If you are a fan of the events and heroes of World War II, you might also be a fan of the "What's The Scuttlebutt?" podcast. The podcast hosts claim to be "your go-to source for deep dives into the events, untold stories, and extraordinary individuals of World War II." But, before delving into WW II history, the first thing we might inquire about, reflecting the podcast's title, is: "Scuttlebutt? What's that?"

A scuttlebutt on early seagoing vessels was a wooden cask that served as the source of fresh water for the ship's residents. "Butt" was another term for a barrel, and to "scuttle" something was simply to put a hole in it. So, the scuttlebutt was a large barrel filled with drinking water that had a hole in the top from which water was ladled.

Not surprisingly, the scuttlebutt became a gathering place where the latest news, rumors, and gossip were shared among the sailors. It would compare to an office water cooler in our day. The meaning of the term "scuttlebutt" morphed over time to refer to the chatter that took place around the cask. The container has changed and become modernized, but one thing that's still as old-fashioned as ever is that we humans like to talk about stuff... and especially about each other.

Jane Austen, in her novel titled *Northanger Abbey*, noted "Every man is surrounded by a neighborhood of voluntary spies." It's one thing to notice others with a charitable eye. It's a completely different matter to compare ourselves with others and to talk about them to put them down while stroking our own egos. Proverbs 11:13 states "A talebearer reveals secrets, but he who is of a faithful spirit conceals a matter" (NKJV). A quote, attributed to Eleanor Roosevelt, has long challenged me: "Great minds discuss ideas; average minds discuss events; small minds discuss people." If you are of a great mind, you'll ladle crystal clear water from the scuttlebutt to serve to your friends.

PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE BLYC BY-LAWS

In our continued effort to update the BLYC By-Laws to remove old and outdated provisions, remove ambiguity, and update language to current standards, the By-Laws Committee presents the following changes, as approved by the Board of Governors for publication this month. *Your feedback is welcomed and appreciated.*

In compliance with Article X of the BLYC Consitution, the following changes to the BLYC Bylaws will be considered by the Board of Governors at their regular meeting to be held on Thursday, September 11, 2025.

Add the following new Bylaw...

Article I, Section 8, Subsection TBD

If a member in good standing authorizes the Club to change their membership with their first mate they must submit a new member application for the current first mate. Upon completion the application will be presented to the board of Governors for a 1st reading and a 2nd reading, which will include a vote on the membership swap. It will take not less than 2/3 of the board to pass the membership swap.

If a member in good standing desires to change their first mate they must submit in writing to the Membership Governor their desire for this to take place. Upon receipt, the change will be presented to the Board of Governors for a 1st reading and a 2nd reading, which will include a vote on the change of first mate. It will take not less than 2/3 of the board to pass the change of first mate.

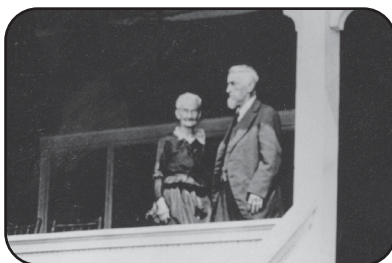
The Sayres and the Sayre Marina...

Before there was a Buckeye Lake Yacht Club, there was a "Sayre Marina." In 1904, Mr. William Henry Sayre built a two-stall boathouse, with living quarters above, just east of "Sunken Island" along Northbank. Henry & Mary Sayre had three sons — Earl, Fred, and Raymond — and a daughter, Eva. Henry Sayre, along with sons Earl and Raymond, all appear in the 1906 BLYC Member Directory and are assumed to have been charter members of the Club. This directory lists their professional affiliation as "Sayre and Sons, Newark." Henry Sayre repaired boats and sold boat supplies from his Northbank location. The three sons would later take over the family business and change the name to Sayre Brothers Marina. In the 1920's, Earl and his wife Blanche also operated a restaurant, open from Memorial Day through Labor Day, located just west of the Marina.

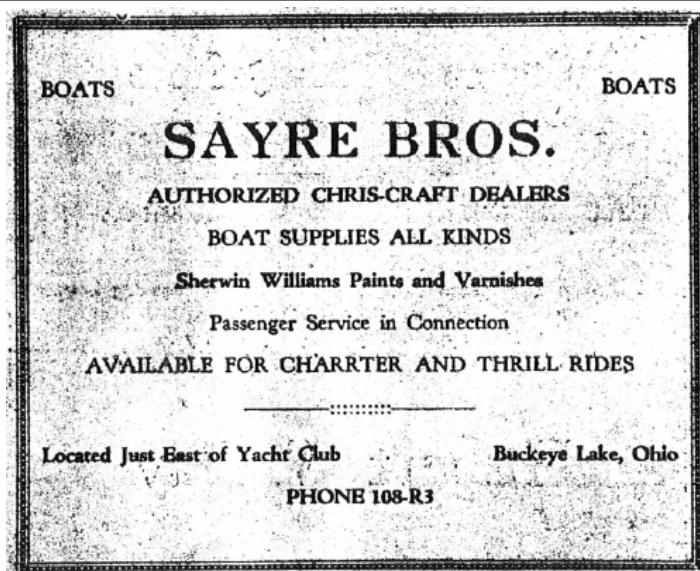
When BLYC located on "Sunken Island" (now Watkins Island) in 1907, and built the original Clubhouse, Henry Sayre became our first "caretaker." He was very active on the building committee and could frequently be found working on improvements to the Club's new home. At the Club's 3rd "Tar Social," held in Newark on December 17, 1908, in recognition of Mr. Sayre's service to BLYC, as caretaker, "improver of the island," one of its hardest working members, and in demonstration of the high esteem in which he was held, the Club extended Mr. Sayre's membership for the rest of his life without further payment of dues — making him BLYC's first Honorary Life Member.

At the time of its closing, Sayre Brothers was the oldest continuously operating Chris Craft dealership in the United States. In 1926, Edgar T. Wolfe, Sr. (BLYC Commodore, 1934) traveled to New York for a boat show. While there he took a fancy to the Chris Craft line of boats. He told the company representatives that he would purchase one, but only if he could get it serviced at Buckeye Lake. The company contacted Fred Sayre and he answered that he would be happy to service Mr. Wolfe's boat, but only if Sayre Brothers was given a franchise... which they were — one of the first two ever issued. Incidentally, according to a letter to BLYC from early member Frank Miller, Chris Smith, founder of Chris Craft, held membership in BLYC in the 1930's. It is believed that this was likely a result of the close relationship between Chris Craft and the Sayre Brothers Marina.

Fred Sayre had a daughter, Blanche, and one son, Bud. Growing up on the shores of Buckeye Lake, Bud was always "messing around with boats." However, he had little interest in taking over the family's marina business. He wanted to become a grocer. But, while Bud was serving in World War II, both his father and his uncle Earl passed away. Returning home from the war, he found two recently widowed women and an aged



Henry & Mary Sayre c. 1920 at BLYC



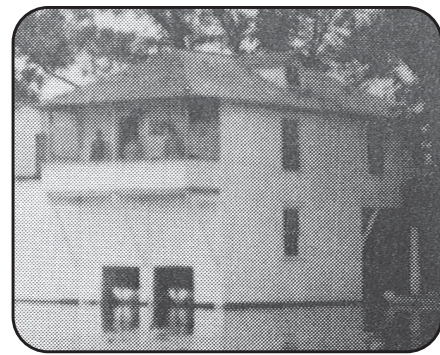

uncle who needed his help to keep the business operating. He assisted them and gradually assumed the helm of the operation. Following the death of his wife, Fran, Bud married Zenna and gave the business to his new wife. He continued to serve as an advisor until his death in 1997. Zenna continued operation of the Marina until its eventual closing in 2008.

Over the years, the relationship between the Sayres and BLYC has been a strong one. While Fred never joined BLYC, his father, brothers, and son were all members and the marina provided great service to the Club for many years. Prior to the installation of our hoist at Eastport, Sayres would haul in and out all of the visiting sailboats at the annual Snowball Regatta free of charge. They also did the same for the Classic Boat Show for many years. Bud and Zenna were also very helpful and instrumental in the development and growth of the Boat Show through the years. In 1996, Bud and Zenna donated the mahogany for the "new" bar at BLYC — now one of the most iconic highlights of our Club. Zenna continued to be active in the Club and with the BLYC Auxiliary until her death in 2015.

Reflecting on her family's long association with BLYC at the time of our Centennial, Zenna thoughtfully remarked, "At eighty-three, in this one-hundredth year of the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club, I am still active in the Club as a perpetual Distaff; I have been a member of the Ladies Auxiliary since my introduction to the Yacht Club in 1974. If you are lucky enough to work by the water and have a beautiful Club to walk to, you are lucky enough."

Like many early landmarks of the lake, Sayres' Marina is now gone. But it should not be forgotten. Some artifacts from its time as a marina are on display at the Boat Yard Tavern, which now occupies the original showroom and marina shop.



