A great Christmas gift for the boater who has almost everything would be a dock at the yacht club! The process is simple: apply online and your boater will receive a dock license agreement in the mail with a gift certificate from you for the invoice!

Dock Lease and Boatyard Storage Lease Renewal:

Invoicing for all docks and Eastport boatyard storage is mailed in February, separate from your monthly statement. To renew your current dock lease agreement, email me in December at docksandrentals@buckeyelakeyc.com. We need you to acknowledge you are renewing or not renewing your dock so we have time to prepare your February invoice in January. If you are renewing, return or email me a copy of your 2026 boat insurance declaration page and the boat registration with your payment. If you are chasing the sun instead of enjoying the winter weather, call your insurance agent and have them email the declaration page.

The Dock Rental Fees for 2026 are as follows:

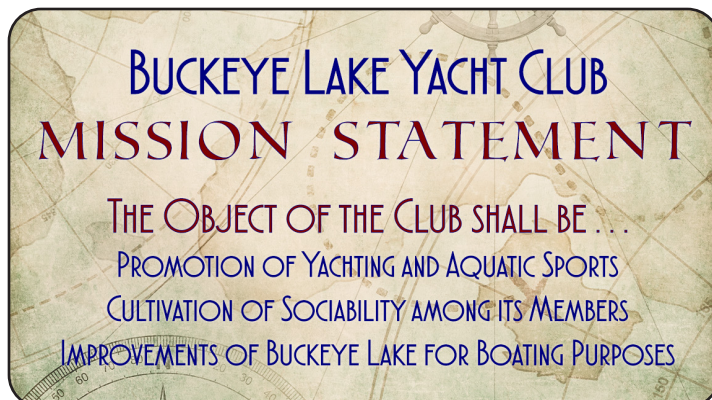

For over 24 years, BLYC has been the home to a Christmas Party hosted for over 120 less-fortunate children of the Buckeye Lake area, and with the difficulties that the families have faced, specifically over the past few years, we need your help now more than ever to make it a bigger success than in year's past.

How does it work?

Lakewood Schools will select families in need from the area, and each child provides us with a Christmas wish list for the committee to utilize when shopping. The committee asks members to sponsor a child for \$50.

When is the Drive-In?

The Christmas Drive-In is December 21st from 2-4 PM at BLYC.

Looking to donate to this cause?

Each year we are able to increase the amount spent per child on toys and clothing through generous donations from members and local businesses; all at no cost to the Club. Thanks to the generosity of our donors last year, we were able to sponsor over 35 families with children at \$150 each, along with donating \$100 gift cards to 40 high school students. Over the last three years, donations have totaled \$15K (2022), \$13K (2023), and \$19K (2024). Our goal for the current year is to see an increase by 20%. Let's make this year bigger and better for the kids!

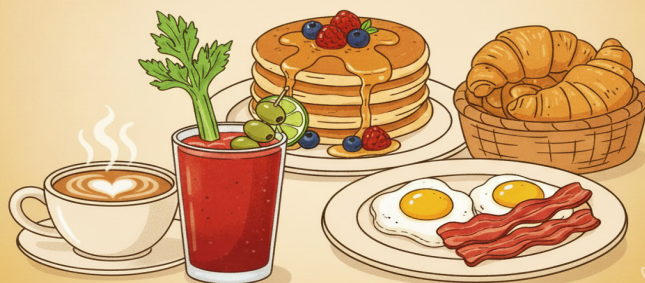

Spinning a Yarn

My parents loved the 60's crooner Andy Williams. Songs like "Moon River," "Where Do I Begin? (Love Story)," and "Born Free" frequently played on the AM radio of our Ford station wagon as my siblings and I cheerfully sang along from the back seat. William's Christmas album was also a favorite, with the perennial hit "It's the Most Wonderful Time of the Year" riding at the top of the family charts.

But it wasn't until years later that I understood the meaning of that song's lyric "There'll be scary ghost stories and tales of the glories of Christmases long, long ago." In times past, before modern forms of entertainment, it was a holiday tradition to sit around the fireplace spinning yarns and telling ghost stories. The ancients believed that the veil between the living and the dead was thinnest during the cold dark months of winter. During the Victorian era, Charles Dicken's "A Christmas Carol" solidified this connection, as his Ghosts of Christmas Past, Present, and Future chilled the spines of readers both young and old.

The phrase "spinning a yarn" originated in nautical slang — perhaps alluding to making ropes from lengths of yarn on board ship: the men would have told one another stories while performing this long and tedious task. Storytelling is part of human nature. When we gather during the holidays with family and friends, is not the bulk of our time spent spinning yarns of past glories and tragedies, laughing and celebrating and mourning with each other as chestnuts roast on the open fire?

During the Christmas season, the whole world's attention focuses on the beautiful narrative about how a young virgin was miraculously found to be "with Child," giving birth to the One whom believers claim to be the Son of God. It sounds far-fetched. Angels, shepherds, wise men and a star guiding their way... either this is "yarn spinning," or it's the glorious and true tale of the greatest Christmas long, long ago.

LOOKING AFT

- P/C Steve Harris, BLYC Historian

Often, we walk through the Clubhouse and walk right past a piece of our history without taking much notice. Having existed for 120 seasons now, we have a very rich history — much of which is on display throughout the Club. A couple of months back, we had our Trophy Night for the 2025 sailing season and someone inquired about the other trophies in our trophy case — those that weren't awarded that evening. Here is the story behind one of them...

The Ghost Trophy

The first Luedke K cat-boat raced at Put-in-Bay during the annual I-LYA Regatta on July 19, 1906 — during BLYC's first year as a club. In December of that year, I-LYA adopted rules establishing 22-foot "K" cat-boats as the official one-design sailboat for all I-LYA races. The class was instantaneously popular, so much so that President Taft donated a cup to Toledo Yacht Club for the K-cat champion in 1909. TYC dominated the series for many years, but later lost the cup to Detroit Yacht Club in 1917. Six years later, TYC would win it back and, in order that TYC never lose it again, the Taft Cup was retired. It is now a trophy awarded to the first place finisher on the short course of TYC's annual Mills Trophy Race — an overnight, long distance race from Toledo to Put-in-Bay raced each June. K-boats were not just popular in the western basin of Lake Erie. They were hugely popular at BLYC as well. Many of the old sailing photos we have from the early days of the Club are those of K-boats. BLYC sailors were very active in the class, both here at home and at the I-LYA Regatta. For several decades, the K-boats were the dominant fleet throughout the region. But, as time passed and technology

improved, the wooden hulled, Marconi-rigged K-boats fell out of popularity in favor of modern, faster, more efficient one-designs.

I wrote recently about Frank Miller and his home at Put-in-Bay. He was one of BLYC's first junior members in 1917; in 1919, at only 18 years of age, he was asked to serve as our Commodore (which he declined); and, he later went on to be Commodore of both Put-in-Bay Yacht Club and I-LYA. He was also a K-boat sailor.

At the 1955 I-LYA Regatta, Frank and his crew skippered his K-boat, *Cat's Paw*. They easily won as, with the decline of the class, they were the only entrant. Commodore Miller would later write, "We were surprised, pleased, and embarrassed when Commodore Lee Wilson presented us with one of the lovely first place silver bowls..." at the awards ceremony. Commodore Miller donated the trophy back to I-LYA as a perpetual trophy — The Ghost Trophy, so named as they amused themselves imagining that they were racing against the "ghosts" of the K-boat fleet of regattas past — for the winner of any K-boats that would race in the I-LYA Regatta. *Cat's Paw* continued to race, often alone, for many years skippered by Commodore Miller and under the BLYC burgee. He would

later sell her to BLYC's Commodore Gus Schell, who carried on the tradition for several years thereafter. Eventually, the Ghost Trophy was retired and has been re-dedicated as the Commodore Gus Schell Trophy, currently awarded to the 5th place finisher in the Laser class at the I-LYA Junior Championships, held at Put-in-Bay each summer in July.

A few years ago, I-LYA Historian (and current Rear Commodore) Tom Thanasiu purchased a "keeper" Ghost Trophy in an estate auction of the contents of Commodore Miller's Put-in-Bay home, *Inselruhe*. He has given it to BLYC on loan and it is currently on display in our trophy case at the Club, along with a short description of the trophy authored by Commodore Miller.

In Toledo there is a K-boat, owned and recently restored by the Western Lake Erie Historical Society, and, until recently, *Cat's Paw* was still here at BLYC. Time takes its toll on all things and old, wooden sailboats are no exception. *Cat's Paw* unfortunately was scrapped just a couple of years ago. The one in Toledo may be the only boat left of this once dominant fleet. But certainly the "ghosts" of the K-boat fleet, including Frank Miller, Gus Schell, Larry Sackett, Brownie Cornell, and many more from here at BLYC, will still join us on the race course for many years to come.
