

Top of the Morning to all the Irish and those who celebrate St. Patrick's Day! Thank you to all our members who are in the process of returning your declaration page to your boat insurance and your boat registration. Please send a copy to docksandrentals@buckeyelakeyc.com. BLYC is required by our liability insurance carrier to have these items on file.

Dock Waiting List: You may ask yourselves "What do I need to do to have a dock on the island?" BLYC has a dock waiting list for all docking areas. Go to our website and complete the dock application with your preferred dock area (Eastport, Area 8, Watkins Island- east, front, or west basin). Consideration for a dock is outlined in the BLYC Constitution and By-Laws and is followed for dock assignments when docks become available.

Eastport Boat Yard: When your boat goes in the water this spring, what will you do with your boat trailer? The lease agreement for boat and trailer storage is for the entire year. Put your boat in the water and leave your trailer in BLYC's secured storage area!

Route 79 Widening Project: The members who have boat storage that will be affected by this project have been notified. The move will occur when arrangements with ODOT and the Village are complete.

April Cleanup Day: The club has new dori pole pennants for the 2026 boating season. We will be putting them up on Spring Work Day in April. Come join us in helping make our docks beautiful and bird free! It is a great way to meet club members and help keep the Club in tip top shape!

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

– Fleet Chaplain Mark Thogmartin

A Hole In the Water?

“A boat is a large hole in the water into which you throw money.”

~ Anonymous

You can't reference famous quotes about boats and boating without addressing the elephant in the room. It's probably safe to say that not one of us who has purchased a boat hasn't had the old adage, above, tossed our direction. And there are the corollaries: “BOAT stands for ‘Break Out Another Thousand’ or ‘Bankruptcy On A Trailer.’”

While the barbs about the expenses associated with boat ownership may be irritating, we know they're true. Waterborne crafts cry out for maintenance, upgrades, licensing, dockage, fuel, and a whole host of bank account and time robbing elements that keep us awake at night and cause us to wonder, “Is it all worth it?”

It is undeniably true that almost every recreational pursuit can consume large amounts of capital. The hobbyist starts out innocently enough: “I'll get this

starter kit, learn the basics, and I'll be happy.” But, inevitably, the law of diminishing returns kicks in. What once provided a nice little thrill soon ceases to bring the satisfaction or adrenalin rush that it once did. So, it begins...a little upgrade here, club memberships there, and travel to exotic locations that provide a better experience. Unchecked, things can get out of hand.

As a chaplain, (former) boat owner, and adventure sport enthusiast, I have two suggestions/perspectives that I hope you might find to be helpful and reflection-worthy:

- Count the costs before you commit. Consider every aspect of boat ownership or, more generally, any new recreational pursuit prior to jumping in. “A well-thought-out plan will work to your advantage, but hasty actions will cost you dearly” (Proverbs 21:5). If you thoroughly weigh the advantages and disadvantages ahead of time, and you believe the cost/benefit ratio is in your favor, then go ahead.
- Learn the secret of contentment. Understand that it's human

nature to always want more. If you love sunsets on the lake, and fellowshiping with friends out on the water, a bigger motor with 100 more horsepower isn't going to make those things any more enjoyable than they are now. The apostle Paul said, “I have learned to be content in whatever circumstances I find myself” (Philippians 4:11b). Contentment, coupled with a clear conscience, brings great reward.

So, take heart. With the appropriate considerations, the acronym BOAT can stand for “Bargain Offering Amazing Treasures.” Wouldn't it be wonderful if your loved ones agreed?



The following article appeared in the April 22, 1911 issue of *The Portsmouth Times*.

A Tribute To Memory Of Hon. George H. Watkins

The last number of the "Drift," a Columbus magazine that is the official organ of the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club, is denominated a memorial number to the late George H. Watkins, of Portsmouth, member of the state board of public works, who was an active member of the club. He worked indefatigably to promote its interests. The "Drift" contains the following eulogy to Mr. Watkins:

"Uncle George" has gone to receive his reward — that greater reward — the approval of his Maker, which, after all, every man really seeks above else.

The depth of our sense of grief at our loss is lessened only by the positive feeling we have, that his reward will be greater — greater by far than we could have given.

Appreciation and thanks are matters of the soul. There can be no satisfaction in words. We have and do feel appreciation and thanks which we cannot express. Our very hearts are moved.

Possibly we are but mocking our grief in vain efforts to voice our feelings, but we must pay tribute to one who won our co-operation and had our fullest confidence through his earnestness and sincerity. Our own Uncle George Watkins was a true friend.

So long as we have life to enjoy the fruits of his labors, just so long will we praise one man who made good on at least one big proposition which he undertook.

George Watkins' was not merely to make good for the satisfaction of seeing accomplishment, not alone for a vindication before the world that he meant what he said, not just a question of personal pride or gratification — his idea was bigger than that. Only those closest to him during his labors for Buckeye Lake and the parks of the state of Ohio can testify competently and their testimony is this: Geo. Watkins wished for the success of his efforts because he had a sincere desire to benefit thousands of people throughout Ohio by providing breathing

places, places where healthy recreation should reign under proper regulations.

The "Friend of Buckeye Lake" was a broad man, capable of large feelings, we all know. We know the warmth of feeling we all experienced toward him which we all felt so incapable of expressing to him. He was a maker of friends and never a loser.

His pleasant manner, the depth and kindness of personal interest which he continually displayed, the gentlemanly dignity, the cordial humor, the smile of the hail fellow, the ring of sincerity in his speech, his inspiring energy, all these, and more, will remain as our memories of him.

We could review his countless efforts, recall his many acts and words, tell of his oft expressed hopes, of his sympathy; tell of the personal sacrifices of his untiring physical labors, for the best interests of Ohio's State Parks and particularly Buckeye Lake. How we will miss him. Thousands praise him where hundreds knew him. No man can do better during his period of life than to help lift the burden in this locality and his fellow men are thankful.

Buckeye Lake in its present form, the New Buckeye Lake is his handiwork and that of the men he enthused and caused to work with him for its betterment. Let it be his gift to make the lives of men brighter — his everlasting monument.

His sincerity we all knew, his hopes, some of us knew, his disappointments only a very few knew. He was too optimistic to talk of discouragements yet some of us knew he encountered them.

Few men live to see their works and acts justified and to see the seal of public approval placed on their efforts. Especially it is true that men in public life engaged in work as servants for their fellow men rarely, if ever, reap any of the praise that may be due them for services rendered and well performed.

We borrow an editorial from the *Dispatch*, Columbus, January 2d, 1911, as a fitting testimonial to Mr. Watkins as being the one most deserving of the blessings that will be and always are showered on those "who made sure that these lakes should be prepared as resorts of recreation and rest for an increasing population." George Watkins lived to see the following said about his work.

The State Parks

"Over half a million people last year visited the state parks, as those reservoirs and natural lakes under the control of the state are called. The patronage is such that there is no longer question of their maintenance from the natural revenues, and the planning is for further accommodations for the people, gymnasiums, bathing beaches, boating facilities, public drives, walks, etc. If there was ever any doubt of the wisdom of maintaining these inland lakes for public use, it has been dispelled, and there is already a suggestion of the blessings that will long be showered on the heads of the legislators and others who made sure that these lakes should be preserved as resorts of recreation and rest for an increasing population.

Some are fortunate enough to be able to travel long distances to ocean or lake side, but more are not.

For these latter, who work in summer as in other seasons of the year, the existence of a park with water near their homes is a boon — a means of health and happiness. The man or men who foresaw all this had a vision worth while, and those who made the vision a reality have but to look about them to find their reward."

His vision was worth while. Our praise can only be feeble as compared with the reality of that "vision" — its value to men.

In George Watkins we found a man — a man who in public service was really honest in a desire to serve well by doing something worth while. We found a ready ear, not for selfish wants, but for the deserving needs of a whole people and, invariably suggestions of the right sort were acted upon by him promptly. He was a friend to many a close friend of all interested for the good of Buckeye Lake, and a closer friends of all his colleagues in office and those who labored with him in the ranks of the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club for the good of the state parks.

The Yacht Club has sung his praise on many occasions. Its members believed in him. They were for him always as a man, regardless of creed or party, they trusted him and their trust was not misplaced. Today they honor his memory and pay tribute to his current endeavors. May his memory remain with all of us as one who attempted much and made good.


