April is the beginning of the boating season. Time to prep your craft and launch your pride and joy! The docks are ready and the lake is at full pool!

Club Work Day is Sunday, April 26th from 9:00 am–12:30 pm. The Docks Committee could use some willing hands to raise the Dori poles and pennants. We will have coffee and donuts to energize you at 9:00 am and pizza and beer to refresh you after we are done. As a bonus, it is a great way to meet other members.

Eastport Boatyard: The combination is 5233 for the gate and lakeside locks in the Eastport boatyard. If you can't remember it, look at the street number hanging on the fence — it is the same. Please do not give this information to non-Club members. If you have guests boating with you, let them in or have them meet you at Watkins Island where you can get the daily guest number from the office and the bar. The port-a-pot and the dumpster will be delivered on April 15th. The water will be turned on by April 25th.

Emergency Numbers: We all want a safe boating season. If an emergency arises on the docks or boats, Race and Regatta put together an Emergency Card that has phone numbers and procedures on it. We have laminated the card and posted them on the gates at the Eastport docks, Area 8 docks, and lakeside at the Eastport boatyard.

Dock and Storage Rental: We have docks and storage available for the boating season. Complete the application on the website. By the way, our rentals are below market price.

Battle of the Birds: After some successes and some failures last summer, we have a plan to relocate the sea gulls from our docks to Lake Erie.

- **Dori Poles and Pennants:** We have purchased more and will install them on Work Day. Please volunteer to help us — no ladders involved.
- All docks will be power washed by middle of May.
- The squawk box on Watkins Island is in place and working. We also have solar powered ones and will place them on Eastport and Area 8 when we power wash.
- If this is not enough, we could purchase replicas of dead sea gulls and place them on the docks. We think it is gross and will not resort to this unless the birds are winning.
- If all else fails, we are calling Alfred Hitchcock.

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

An Ocean Diploma

“...a whale-ship was my Yale College and my Harvard.”

~ Herman Melville

This year I've made it a goal to read Herman Melville's classic *Moby Dick*. Having labored through about one-third of the book, I can say it's been both a challenge and a joy. Melville is a master wordsmith, right up there with the great authors of English literature. People like me only tinker with syllables, commas, and a metaphor from time to time. Herman Melville takes those same raw materials and fabricates vast verbal empires that provide his readers with temporary sanctuary from the hassles of everyday life.

Surprisingly, Melville never had any formal literary education past the age of 12. He did dabble in several occupations before discovering his true “university” aboard a whaling ship. It surprised me to find out that these ships often had well-stocked libraries that included contemporary works of law, biology, and theology. Melville consumed these textbooks during the long hours of relative inactivity while at sea. Add to this the multicultural experience while living with and visiting people from civilizations all over the world. Thus, the quote cited above. Melville received a world class education while working on a smelly, sweaty whaling ship.

Too often our culture has minimized the experiences, education, and influence reflected in some of the more menial occupations. Being an educator by trade, I believe schooling is mighty important. I preached to my three boys while they were under our roof, “The more you learn, the wider your horizons. Take every opportunity to add to your resume.” Even so, I've grown increasingly appreciative of the craft-persons we all encounter every day. One of my favorite biblical proverbs reads, “Do you see a man skillful in his work? He will stand before kings; he will not stand before obscure men” (Proverbs 22:29, ESV).

There's nobility in every legitimate profession. With the advances in artificial intelligence making some information-based occupations nearly obsolete, the skilled trades are more attractive and profitable than ever for those entering the workforce. And what would we do without the humble, cheerful folks who wait on us in hotels, food establishments, grocery stores, and countless other service-based jobs every day? Be sure to appreciate and express gratitude to everyone for the work they do. “In humility count others more significant than yourselves.” (Philippians 2:3, ESV).

Tornadoes & BLYC

While sitting at my desk working on the Log mid-March, the storm siren blew and I was reminded that it was Severe Weather Awareness Week in Ohio. Just a little over a week earlier, we had a tornado warning! Now, I don't know if weather is getting worse or not, but it did remind me of our Club's history with these scientifically fascinating, yet extremely dangerous weather phenomena and how quickly a beautiful day in Ohio can go from sunny fun on the water to life-threatening in mere moments.

Several tornadoes have hit the lake area throughout BLYC's history. One of the deadliest was on June 11, 1922. Narrowly missing Watkins Island, the devastation in the Buckeye Lake Park and neighborhoods to our east was significant and led to three deaths and an estimated 20 to 100 injured. In that time, most of the area was occupied "summer homes," little more than small cottages which offered minimal protection to those seeking shelter — nearly 50 were destroyed in the Neel Addition (west of present-day SR 79 from 1st to 4th Streets) alone. News reports indicate that "hundreds" of boats were on the water at the time it struck, leading to a massive search & rescue effort on the water as well as on land.

While BLYC escaped unscathed, we would not be as lucky with the next storm just a few years later, in 1928. Like the 1922 storm, it came quickly. Here is a brief synopsis from Commodore Kyle Armstrong's 1951 book, *Story of Buckeye Lake Yacht Club*:

Sunday had been hot and humid, but not unbearable to those at the lake. No one had really wanted to go home that evening. But, as usual on the second day of the week, few people remained at Watkins Island for the following day, Monday the 18th of June.

Throughout the morning and until mid-afternoon it rained steadily. Then it let up a little, and the gray overcast appeared to be breaking with scarcely a breath of surface air stirring.

But, looking northward, a big black cloud was looming over the horizon. And turning to the southwest, a white one of apparently equal volume appeared about equidistant. With the lake still practically calm but



eerie, these contrasting masses moved closer and closer with rapid acceleration until, in the west, they collided with a crash as though it were the crack-of-doom.

Their impact seemed to set them spinning. And as they spun, they seemed to wind themselves into a single, swirling, funnel-like mass with a whipping limber spout. With a freshening surface breeze springing generally toward it, the monstrous thing appeared to grow larger.

Roaring and hissing, it came up the towpath, spewing from its superstructure leafless trees, featherless birds, boards, slivers, and debris of indescribable varieties. Lifting cottages from their foundations, it tossed them both landward and waterward.

Then, passing over Watkins Island with a screaming, twisting wind of immeasurable velocity and mostly upward, it blanked out everything in its path as though under a rising, whirling waterfall in defiance of the force of gravity.

Within three minutes, this vicious thing had come and done its nefarious, task and passed on across the lake with its energy largely expended.

Along with nearly 1500 feet of almost wholly demolished towpath property, the Club's premises were a mess. A roofless two-story cottage was left grounded in a nearly upright position in the lake just off the Club's beach. The back channel was a sea of debris and uprooted trees which had tumbled in from all directions. Catboats, in their back-channel slips, were covered with litter but most of them still floating.

The island was bestrewn with rubbish and, especially along its north and south shorelines, considerable quantities of its earth had washed from behind newly broken places in its seawalls.

Structures on the island had fared no better. Roof coverings, sheathing and rafters were completely gone from the north end

of the boathouse and most of the south side of the clubhouse. Elsewhere, much of their coverings had been lifted off. There was nothing left of the front porch, above its floor line, excepting rails, posts and beams to the east of its front steps. Surprisingly little glass was broken, but, inside, much of the clubhouse and its furnishings had been thoroughly drenched.



The Club, with its own hands, concentrated its efforts on cleaning up its premises. Reconstruction, of course, was something largely for professionals. Estimated costs for such work were in the neighborhood of \$5,000.00, and the Club's insurance covering it amounted to only \$1,000.00. The Club didn't have the other \$4,000.00.

To make up for this deficiency, an assessment of \$10.00 was levied upon each member, and all were urged to contribute as much more as possible. Fortunately, economic conditions were rising toward the highest peak in the history of the country. All except two members came through with at least their assessed minimums, and some contributed various larger amounts ranging up to \$300.00. The total thus realized came to nearly \$6,000.00. This with proceeds from insurance made available something like \$7,000.00.

Fortunately, there were no deaths reported at Buckeye Lake as the storm struck on a Monday. Had the storm struck Watkins Island on a busy Sunday afternoon, it would have likely been a much different story.
